Dear County Supervisors, I'm writing this letter against the proposal to build 1000 homes on the Glen Annie golf course. It seems like there has been no foresight into what this project will do to our local community. I understand that we need to have a quota of housing for people in the area, but putting these homes and this project in such a close proximity to Dos Pueblos high school and Brandon Elementary will be disastrous. Getting off at Glen Annie is already a dangerous situation, and I have witnessed many accidents by drivers trying to exit at the last second. Just the other day I saw four cars parked on the side at the exit to Glen Annie that had been involved in an accident. As a result of this accident bumper to bumper traffic went south all the way until Patterson Avenue. This is just one example of what will happen and probably be even more magnified if you go through with building homes on this site. The welfare of our students is a priority and you are allowing a project like this to jeopardize the safety of our students and families in the area. The roads simply cannot handle this proposed project. Would you want your kids to be driving in this traffic on a daily basis or riding their bikes down Cathedral Oaks with all the cars that will be added to the roadways? This is a very big issue!

The inclusion of open space and other amenities will also attract more people and cars. I'm asking you to not approve this project. The negatives definitely outweigh the benefits and you really need to look at this project and understand what a detriment it will be to the entire Goleta valley.
