Background

- Board received AgVAN progress report on September 28, 2010
- Board determined AgVAN was not a viable program for our region
- Directed staff to return in spring 2011 with information about ending AgVAN
- SBCAG on March 17, 2011 voted to join Cal Vans, a state-wide vanpooling agency





Purpose

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Public Works requests the Board's direction for the remaining Agricultural Worker Transportation Program (AWTP) grant funds – approx. \$1.8 mil.





Options

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Option A– Cal Vans Request

Final purchase of vans utilizing approx. 50% of the remaining AWTP grant funds

Option B

Do not purchase vans. Pay final AgVAN operating expenses through June 30, 2011 to be reimbursed with AWTP grant funds





Option A Details

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 County would procure from Kings County 35 new vans for \$998,494 (approx. \$28k/van)

• Vans will not be used while owned by the County of Santa Barbara





Option A Details (cont.)

- Santa Barbara County would be *legal owner*
- Kings County would be *registered and insured owner*
- Kings County would name the County of S.B. as *additionally insured*





Option A Details (cont.)

- The County of Santa Barbara would transfer \$998,494, to be reimbursed by Caltrans from AWTP grant funds
- County of Santa Barbara would transfer *legal* ownership of vans back to Kings County
- All remaining grant funds (approximately \$800,000) would revert to the State





Option A Benefits

- Funding received by Kings County would allow Cal Vans to maintain a satellite office in Santa Maria over the next 2-3 years
- Local presence could provide valuable assistance to commuters facing:
 - higher gas prices
 - traffic congestion caused by replacing the Santa Maria River Bridge and widening Hwy. 101 on the South Coast





Option A Benefits (cont.)

- Satellite Cal Vans office located in SMOOTH's building
- Cal Vans employee would facilitate vanpools for local employers
- Depending on program growth, a permanent Cal Vans office could be located in our region





Recommended Actions

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That the Board of Supervisors:

- A) Receive and file the closure report regarding the County's Agricultural Worker Transportation Program (AWTP);
- B) Authorize the County Purchasing Manager to procure 35 GMC, fifteen 15-passenger vans to transfer to Cal Vans for \$998,494;
- C) Upon approval of Recommendation B, approve the budget revision for the purchase of 35 GMC, fifteen 15-passenger vans
- D) Authorize the transfer of 35 new vans, 16 existing vans, office furniture, and copier under County ownership to Kings County by June 30, 2011 for use by Cal Vans
