This letter is an official request from Maria Ygnacio Farm Collective in compliance with the proposal amendment to Article X, in that we are qualified cultivators, as of the date of January 19, 2016, requesting the determination of the property, located at 1900 N San Marcos Rd, Santa Barbara Ca, 93111 parcel 153-310-017 which is a 9.9 acre Mt-100 zoning, is confirmed as a legal non conforming use pursuant to agenda #17-00753 attachment 4.2 ("if an existing cultivator including applicant for state license, requests such a determination before the time at which the board of supervisors adopts ordinances amending the county zoning ordinances.")

As of January 19, 2016, the parcel has been continuously cultivating medical marijuana in compliance with all State of California laws and in compliance with all local ordinances.

Please see attached sellers permit, and a 2011 county ordinance in which we were named as a "non store front collective", as evidence we were established and existing before January 19, 2016 date.

Also, please review the third attachment in reference to a Oct 31, 2016 letter and inspection by the zoning enforcement of our property which no determination of violation was found. Our parcel has been under review since the date. Case #16zev-00000-00299. During the investigation, we revealed full documentation to Kimberly McCarthy requests for bank statements, tax information, corporate documents, membership agreements, membership documentation and recommendations, and sellers permit. She reviewed all, and requested site visit which we granted. Site visit team included Petra L zoning enforcement coordinator, Kimberly McCarthy, Eric Snyder, a well as two fire marshals, and two head of narcotics. There investigation showed no violations, we talked to everybody, answered all questions, and on Narcotics request Cody Hemmah brought documentation that included members agreements, and inspection of date of recommendations by head of narcotics.

Also attached is our Articles of incorporation, and letter to sheriffs department.

We are giving all this information, and have gone above an beyond to show our compliance, and are requesting the county of Santa Barbara to send an official letter to the State of California (with courtesy copy be delivered to Robert Bjorklund at the above address) confirming that Parcel # 153-310-017 is in a current status as a legal non-conforming use and that the grow operation is officially authorized by the County of Santa Barbara.



This letter is to inform your office of Maria Ygnacio Farm Collective's full compliance and cooperation with the State of California Attorney General, Edmund G. Brown Jr., Guidelines for the Security and Non-diversion of Marijuana Grown for Medical Use program which was implemented into the County of Santa Barbara in February, 2006. This letter follows the previous letter that was sent by me to your office over a year ago, April 8, 2009. Both letters express that I and the Maria Ygancio Farm Oollective desire to work with transparency and in conjunction with the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department.

My name is Robert Bjorklund. I have read and am familiar with the Regulations & Statutes, as found on the California Department of Public Health's website, including but not limited to: Senate Bill 420, Compassionate Use Act, Health and Safety Code, etc.

Pursuant to the Attorney General's Guidelines, I have created a collective above address. The farm Collective. The farm collective is located at the including medicinal marijuans. Mana Ygnacio Farm Collective grows specifically and only for those who have joined the Mana Ygnacio Farm Collective grows specifically and verified their physician's statement pursuant to the Health and Safety Code Section verified their physician's statement pursuant to the Health and Safety Code Section 1362.5. In addition, interpretativith a few other collectives, (also in compliance with the above referenced regulations and statutes), to grow for their named member/patient users. In total, I am responsible for growing medicine for over one-hundred patients.

I intend to work closely with local law enforcement officers, to insure non-diversion of medical marijuana.
