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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AGENCY TO CONDUCT FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECKS

RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, Penal Code Sections 11105(b)(11) and 13300(b)(11) authorize cities, counties and districts to access state and local summary criminal history information for employment or certification purposes; and

WHEREAS, Penal Code Section 11105(b)(11) authorizes cities, counties and districts to access federal level criminal history information by transmitting fingerprint images and related information to the Department of Justice to be transmitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and

WHEREAS, Penal Code Sections 11105(b)(11) and 13300(b)(11) require that there be a requirement or exclusion from employment or certification based on specific criminal conduct on the part of the subject of the record; and

WHEREAS, Penal Code Sections 11105(b)(11) and 13300(b)(11) require the city council, board of supervisors, or governing body of a city, county or district to specifically authorize access to summary criminal history information for employment or certification purposes; and

WHEREAS, effective July 1, 2010 the State of California has mandated that all prospective Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) candidates are required to complete a Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal background check in addition to the Department of Justice criminal background check.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Santa Barbara County Emergency Medical Services Agency is hereby authorized to access state and federal level summary criminal history information for certification (including volunteers and contract employees) for EMT certification purposes and may not disseminate the information to a private entity; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Santa Barbara County Emergency Medical Services Agency shall not consider a person who has been convicted of a violent or serious felony or misdemeanor eligible for certification (including volunteers and contract employees) except that such conviction may be disregarded if it is determined that mitigating circumstances exist, or that the conviction is not related to the certification, employment or volunteer in question. **PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara, State of California, this _____ day of _____, 2010, by the following vote:
