Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a. Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to accept the ARRA California Emergency Management Agency (CAL EMA) Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program Grant in the amount of \$532,253 for the three year funding cycle of October 2009 through September 2012.
- b. Adopt attached budget revision recognizing the unanticipated revenue.

Summary Text:

Utilizing \$532,253 in Cal EMA Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program grant funds, the Department plans to provide staffing and administrative support for the Santa Barbara Probation Report and Resource Center (SB PRRC). Services will be provided at the existing Department facility located at 4500 Hollister Avenue in Santa Barbara. Services will be slowly implemented at the Probation Office at 117 E. Carrillo Street, until the classroom space currently utilized by the Counseling and Education Center on Hollister Ave. becomes available in July 2010. This is a cost effective utilization of resources, and will provide one large and two small classrooms for PRRC programming. Two full time

equivalent (FTE) positions consisting of a Senior Deputy Probation Officer (Senior DPO) and Deputy Probation Officer (DPO) will be responsible for the delivery of services and facilitation of Evidence-Based Programming at the SB PRRC. The Senior Deputy Probation Officer will be lead in evaluating cases and overseeing case planning in consultation with the supervision DPO and treatment providers. The Senior DPO and the DPO will provide programming as appropriate or be present to monitor other treatment options provided at the SB PRRC, log attendance, and monitor adherence to PRRC case plan by probationers. A .5 FTE (half-time) Administrative Office Professional (AOP) position is also funded. The AOP will have the responsibility of gathering and preparing data as required by the grant.

The SB PRRC will focus on reducing recidivism by delivering evidence-based strategies and programming to adult felons on probation. Probationers at high risk for ultimate incarceration in the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) will be a primary focus. Criminogenic needs will be assessed utilizing a validated assessment tool. Services will be concentrated through intensive case management guided by individual needs assessment, participation in cognitive behavioral groups, drug testing, referrals for treatment and the utilization of graduated sanctions. Probation has secured programming for job development, Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC) support groups for substance abusing adults which are facilitated by alcohol and drug abuse treatment personnel, and Thinking for Change sessions. Thinking for Change is an integrated, cognitive behavior change program for offenders, which includes cognitive restructuring, social skills development, and development of problem solving skills. This program, provided by the National Institute of Corrections (NIC) and facilitated by qualified Probation staff, has been shown to reduce recidivism. As community partnerships and other funding resources continue to be developed they will enrich the evidence-based SB PRRC programming.

Background:

On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Public Law 111-5, or "ARRA) with the intended purpose of creating/maintaining jobs and reenergizing the economy. Included in the ARRA package is funding for various federal agencies to provide a multitude of federal programs and almost \$2 billion for state and local law enforcement for criminal justice activities through the Recovery Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program. Cal EMA, as the State Administrative Agency (SAA) in California, was awarded over \$135 million under the Recovery JAG Program and of this amount, approximately \$44 million was allocated to support the Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program (EBPSP). On December 8, 2009, the Department received authorization from the Board to submit and sign the grant award agreement for the ARRA Cal EMA Evidence-Based Probation Supervision Program.

Funding for the EBPSP is being distributed proportionately to qualifying county probation departments based on each county's population of adults between 18 and 25 years of age, provided that each county receive a minimum of \$33,000. These are one-time grant funds for expenditure between October 1, 2009 and September 30, 2012. This funding is to be utilized in providing evidence-based supervision, programs, or services to adult felony probationers to reduce the likelihood that these individuals will commit new crimes or other violations resulting in the imposition of a state prison sentence. To receive funding, departments must demonstrate that the programs for which they are seeking funds are evidence-based and targeted toward adult felony probationers. An evidence-based program for adult probationers must have empirical evidence that the program has been shown to reduce rates of reoffending, re-arrest, re-conviction, or re-incarceration for program participants or that the program is considered a best practice in criminal justice literature.

The EBPSP funds will enable the Department to build evidence-based programming alternatives in the Adult Division. Resources and support in the community as well as a robust system of intermediate sanctions are important elements of an evidence-based system. Currently the Department has reallocated resources to create the Santa Maria PRRC for this purpose; the EBPSP funds will enable the Department to open the Santa Barbara PRRC to address the significant need for evidence-based programming and intermediate sanctions available to probationers in the south county, spreading the benefits of the program county-wide.

Performance Measure:

Ensure that 65% adult probationers successfully completing the Thinking for Change program at the Santa Barbara PRRC are not returned to court for a new law violation within 6 months of completing the program.

Ensure that 50% of adult probationers successfully completing the Work and Gain Economic Self-Sufficiency (WAGE\$\$) program are gainfully employed or participating in vocational/educational programming within 90 days of program completion.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The revenue from this grant will reduce the impact of State and County General Fund reductions. There are no facility impacts and no increase to the Probation Department's General Fund contribution.

Narrative:

The grant is a 3 year grant. FY 2009-10 grant-funded expenditures will total \$87,846. The grant will result in the reinstatement/preservation of a Senior DPO, DPO, and .5 AOP that would have otherwise been displaced due to FY 2009-10 reductions. The FY 2010-11 revenue and expenditures related to this program will be included in the Department's FY 2010-11 proposed budget. There is no match requirement. The grant fully funds the 2.5 FTEs needed to staff the SB PRRC. The grant allows the funds to be expended prior to the end of the three year period.

Probation Department: Increase appropriations by \$87,846 in FY 2009-10 as part of the \$532,253 three year grant from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act 2009 (ARRA) California Emergency Management Agency (Cal-EMA) Evidence Based Probation Supervision Recovery Act Program for the Probation Report and Resource Center in Santa Barbara.

This budget revision increases revenues by \$87,846 for the three year ARRA award from Cal-EMA LI Acct 4560 "ARRA - Federal Direct". This grant revenue will be used to fund 1.0 FTE Deputy Probation Officer Senior, 1.0 FTE Deputy Probation Officer and a .5 FTE Administrative Office Professional for the Probation Report and Resource Center in Santa Barbara. Appropriations will be increased in the Salaries and Benefits by \$77,574 and in the Services and Supplies LI Acct 7450 by \$7,865 for start up and various office expenses, Special Departmental Expense LI Acct 7650 by \$1,869 for drug testing supplies and bus tokens for clients Training & Travel LI Acct 7730 by \$538 for grant-required travel. A grant amount of \$278,397 will be included in the FY 2010-11 budget. The grant period is from October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2012 and the total of the three year grant is \$532,253.
