Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors execute the Lease Agreement between the County of Santa Barbara and the Hearts Therapeutic Equestrian Center (AKA Hearts Adaptive Riding Program), a local nonprofit organization.

Summary Text:

The initial term of the Lease is ten years commencing on June 1, 2010. The Lease also contains two options of five (5) years each to extend the term. The Lease grants authority to the Director of Public Works to execute those extensions if they are requested by the Hearts Adaptive Riding Program ("Hearts"), and Hearts is in compliance with all the Lease terms and conditions. The Lease contains language allowing either party to terminate upon eighteen (18) months written notice, and acknowledges the agreement between Hearts and Public Works to revise the lease boundaries in accordance with the Exhibit attached to the Lease.

Background:

Hearts Adaptive Riding Programs has provided therapeutic horseback riding to individuals (particularly children) with disabilities on a portion of the closed Foothill landfill since March 16, 1981. The Foothill Landfill is adjacent to the Sheriff's Headquarters and the South Coast Recycling Center and Transfer Station on the Calle Real Campus; the Landfill has limited use due to continued settlement and extensive regulatory requirements. Hearts Adaptive Riding Program and your Board have amended the March 16, 1981 agreement on two occasions; in 1986 (Amendment 1) and in 2006 (Amendment 2).

Both parties felt the need to update the terms and conditions of the 1981 Lease. Today's action reflects that effort in the form of a new lease. In addition to updating insurance and utility provision, the Lease includes an initial 10 year term with two five year extensions. This will allow Hearts to provide a high quality program and assists with fund raising activities.
