
Draft 2010-2015 Consolidated Plan

Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors May 11, 2010



What is the Consolidated Plan?

- Federal grant application to the U.S.
 Department of Housing and Urban
 Development (HUD) representing \$20m over the Plan life
- Required to obtain 3 HUD entitlement grants:
 - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
 - HOME Investment Partnerships Act (HOME)
 - Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG)
- Submitted every five years, updated annually by Annual Action Plan
- HCD prepares on behalf of partners of the HOME Consortium and CDBG Urban County Partnership





What is the Plan Required to Include?

- Establishes local funding priorities, goals and objectives consistent with three federal goals:
 - Goal I: Decent, affordable housing
 - Goal II: Suitable living environment
 - Goal III: Expanded economic opportunity
- Plan is built on stakeholder participation and input throughout our community
- Contents include:
 - Needs Assessment
 - Five-year Strategic Plan
 - Annual Action Plan





HCD Provides Regional Leadership















- Region qualifies to receive HUD entitlement funding through two partnerships:
 - Santa Barbara County HOME Consortium
 - CDBG Urban County Partnership
- County HCD administrative lead agency
 - Responsible for funding management, administration, and regulatory compliance
- County and participating jurisdictions each receive a pro-rated share of CDBG and HOME funding



CDBG

- Funding must benefit low and moderate income residents
- Eligible activities include:
 - Infrastructure
 - Housing rehabilitation
 - Economic development
 - Community/public services
- Local projects must meet one of three federal objectives
 - Benefit low and moderate income persons
 - Aid in the prevention or elimination of slums and blight
 - Meet other community development urgent needs
- Urban County Partnership receives \$2 million annually



HOME

- Funding to expand affordable housing opportunities for low and moderate income households
- Eligible activities include:
 - Construction
 - Rehabilitation
 - First-time homebuyer assistance
 - Rental assistance
- HOME Consortium receives \$1.8 million annually





Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG)

- Grant provides shelter and supportive services to the homeless
- Eligible activities include:
 - Shelter operations
 - Essential services
 - Homeless prevention services
 - Rehabilitation of existing shelters
- County receives \$89,000 annually





Drafting the Plan

Public Outreach

- 120 community stakeholders representing over 50 organizations
- Needs assessment survey in both English and Spanish
- 9 community forums held across the County
 - 4 held by our partner cities of Santa Maria and Lompoc
 - 5 held by County HCD
- 30-day public review period (April 17 May 16)

Plan Development

 Draft Plan reflects balance between HUD requirements and local needs, as well as community stakeholder input



CDBG Funding Priorities

- Derived from current congressional goals, HUD priorities and stakeholder input
 - Services
 - for persons with special needs
 - for low and moderate income households
 - that prevent discrimination
 - Economic development
 - Community and public facilities
 - Opportunities to improve ADA compliance
 - Maintain and upgrade existing affordable housing
 - Programs that create and sustain long term affordable housing
 - Energy efficiency and conservation design measures



HOME Funding Priorities

- Derived from current congressional goals, HUD priorities and stakeholder input
 - Lower income rental housing for large, small, and special needs (homeless, disabled, elderly) households
 - Permanent supportive housing for households at risk of becoming homeless, and/or special needs clients
 - Opportunities to assist first-time homebuyers
 - Opportunities to improve ADA compliance
 - Energy efficiency and conservation design measures
 - Proximity of projects to jobs, transit and services





Summary

Consolidated Plan

- Submitted by County on behalf of HOME and CDBG partners
- Allows region to maintain eligibility for \$20 million in CDBG, HOME and ESG funding over next 5 years
- Funding supports over 40 organizations countywide, providing vital services to over 200,000 residents countywide



Recommendation

- Receive and file a staff report and update regarding the development and submittal of the Santa Barbara County HOME Consortium and Urban County Partnership draft 2010-2015 Consolidated Plan, a HUD required five year strategic planning document describing the priorities, goals and objectives for allocation and expenditure of federal community development entitlement funding over the next five years.
- Direct staff to return to the Board on May 25, 2010 for final consideration of the Santa Barbara County HOME Consortium and Urban County Partnership 2010-2015 Consolidated Plan and related documentation
