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Summary Text:

County Service Area 3 (CSA 3) serves the unincorporated Goleta and Santa Barbara areas. CSA 3 provides operations and maintenance of streetlights; maintenance of parks and open space; and enhanced library services. Revenue to fund CSA 3 services is collected from property tax distributions and two benefit assessments. This action requests adoption of the street lighting benefit assessment rates for CSA 3 for fiscal year 2010-2011. No changes to the rates are proposed. The enhanced Library services benefit assessment will return to your Board under a separate action.

Background:

County Service Area 3 (CSA 3) was formed July 23, 1962 by Resolution No. 22409. CSA 3 boundaries include the unincorporated, urbanized area of the Goleta Valley between the cities of Goleta and Santa Barbara. Powers it may exercise, as recognized by the Santa Barbara Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO) include street lighting, open space and park maintenance and enhanced library services.

One of the functions of CSA 3 is to operate and maintain 1,387 streetlights currently within its service area. Southern California Edison (SCE) owns the poles and fixtures and provides the streetlighting service in CSA 3. SCE provides maintenance and electricity, they bill monthly for this service. Maintenance represents 78% of the costs while electricity is only 22%. Additional lights are installed through development (pursuant to Resolution 81-229) and must meet County Engineering Design Standards.

CSA 3 is funded with property taxes and two separate benefit assessments. Total revenue for fiscal year 2010-2011 is \$981,511 and is comprised of \$744,986 in property taxes, \$165,893 in benefit assessments for libraries \$66,632 in benefit assessments for streetlighting and \$4,000 in interest earnings.

Expenditures in CSA 3 for the most part are tied to a source of revenues: 100% of the Library Benefit Assessment revenue is expended on Library Services, while maintenance for parks and open space is funded completely by the property tax contribution. Streetlighting however is funded by a combination of the streetlighting benefit assessment and property taxes. The table below shows the budgeted amount and the source of funds for the various services provided in CSA 3.

Based on this level of service for next year, expenditures will exceed revenues by \$50,349 (\$1,031,860 - \$981,511) and the CSA 3 fund balance will be reduced to cover the shortfall. The current fund balance is \$222,442 and at the end of fiscal year 2010-2011 the balance is estimated to be \$172,093. At the current level of service, the fund balance will be depleted in fiscal year 2014-2015. Attachment A shows the revenue, expense, and fund balance history, as well as future projections for CSA 3. The Public Works Department in conjunction with the Park Department is reviewing service level needs and intends to make a recommendation that addresses the complexity surrounding these issues. Without additional revenue sources, service levels primarily dependent on property tax revenue will need to be reduced.

As previously stated, the Library Benefit Assessments will come to your Board as a separate action. The recommendation for your consideration is to set the streetlighting benefit assessment rate for next fiscal year. Staff recommends maintaining the existing \$8 streetlighting benefit assessment per residential parcel. The rate is adjusted for vacant land, residential, multiple residential, apartments, commercial, industrial, churches, and government categories.

Performance Measure:

No change to the streetlighting level of service provided by CSA 3 is proposed.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

No fiscal changes are proposed to the County Service Area 3 benefit assessment rates.
