b) Approve Budget Revision Request No. 0000879 for \$500,000.00, recognizing revenue from insurance reimbursements for the cleaning of the painted murals in the Santa Barbara Courthouse by South Coast Fine Arts Conservation Center, Inc., and appropriating the expenses in the General Fund 0001.
