**SUBJECT:** Amendment to the Santa Barbara County Single Comprehensive Conflict of Interest Code for County "Local Agencies" (Single Code)

---

## Recommendations for action to be taken in the following sequential order:

- A. That the County of Santa Barbara Board of Supervisors (Board of Supervisors) set March 22, 2005, as the date for public hearing for the Board of Supervisors to consider and approve (1) the adoption of the resolution revising Resolution No. 95-450 referenced in Item B below and (2) the proposed Amendment No. 11 to the Santa Barbara County Single Comprehensive Conflict of Interest Code for County "Local Agencies" (Single Code) referenced in Item C below.
- B. That the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached resolution that amends Exhibit AA-2 of Resolution No. 95-450, as amended, in the following manner:

Revises Exhibit AA-2 of said Resolution No. 95-450, as amended, to add (1) the Santa Barbara County Housing and Community Development Department, and (2) the Montecito Board of Architectural Review to the Single Code.
- C. That the Board of Supervisors approve proposed Amendment No. 11 to the Single Code adopted by the Santa Barbara County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor (Clerk-Recorder) for agencies specified in Resolution No. 95-450, as amended.

## Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

Law and Business Necessity: The recommendation is primarily aligned with actions required by law or business necessity.

## **Executive Summary and Discussion:**

On October 3, 1995, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 95-450 that provides for the adoption of the Single Code for those county departments, commissions and dependent special districts identified in the resolution. Thereafter, the Board of Supervisors made several amendments to Resolution No. 95-450 adding and deleting agencies subject to the Single Code.

The attached resolution adds 1) the Santa Barbara County Housing and Community Development Department, and (2) the Montecito Board of Architectural Review as agencies that are subject to the Single Code.

The attached resolution also recognizes an agency name change (1) from the Santa Barbara County Economic Development Advisory Committee/Job Creation Investment Task Force (2) to the Economic Vitality Committee, listed at Ex. C-38 in Exhibit AA-2 of the resolution.

In order to implement Resolution No. 95-450, the Clerk-Recorder adopted the Single Code, on December 5, 1995, and the Board of Supervisors approved the Single Code on December 19, 1995. Thereafter, the Board of Supervisors approved Amendments Nos. 1 through 10 to the Single Code that were adopted by the Clerk-Recorder.

The Clerk-Recorder adopted Amendment No. 11 to the Single Code on February 22, 2005. Amendment No. 11 is effective when approved by the Board of Supervisors.

Amendment No. 11, as adopted by the Clerk-Recorder, revises exhibits in the Single Code for each respective agency listed below in the following manner:

(1) Revises and amends the following exhibits, which set forth designated positions and disclosure categories for designated positions, in the current Single Code to reflect personnel or agency name changes for each listed agency:

- a) Exhibit No. C-4 (Designated Positions) for the Laguna County Sanitation District;
- b) Exhibit No. C-12 (Designated Positions) for the Santa Barbara County Clerk-Recorder;
- c) Exhibit No. C-16 (Designated Positions) for the Santa Barbara County General Services Department;
- d) Exhibit No. C-20 (Designated Positions) for the Santa Barbara County Alcohol, Drug, and Mental Health Services Department;
- e) Exhibit No. C-21 (Designated Positions) for the Santa Barbara County Office of the Administrator;
- f) Exhibit No. C-25 (Designated Positions) for the Santa Barbara County Human Resources Department;
- g) Exhibit No. C-27 (Designated Positions) for the Santa Barbara County Planning and Development Department;

- l) Exhibit No. C-34 (Designated Positions) for the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Santa Barbara;
- m) Exhibit No. C-37 (Designated Positions) for the Workforce Investment Board; and
- n) Exhibit No. C-38 (Designated Positions) for the Economic Vitality Committee;

(2) Adds (i) the Santa Barbara County Housing and Community Development Department and (ii) the Montecito Board of Architectural Review as agencies that are subject to the Single Code.

AMENDMENT NO. 11  
TO THE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY  
SINGLE COMPREHENSIVE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE  
FOR LOCAL AGENCIES SPECIFIED  
IN SANTA BARBARA COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 95-450,  
AS AMENDED

(1) The Political Reform Act, Government Code § 81000 et seq., provides that state and local agencies adopt and amend, as circumstances require, and promulgate conflict of interest codes.

(2) The Fair Political Practices Commission adopted a regulation, title 2 of the California Code of Regulations § 18730, which contains the terms for a model standard conflict of interest code (hereinafter "Standard Code"), which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendment to the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings.

(3) Pursuant to Santa Barbara County Resolution No. 95-450, as amended, which authorizes the Santa Barbara County Clerk-Recorder-Assessor (Clerk-Recorder) to adopt a single comprehensive conflict of interest code for those agencies identified in said resolution, the Clerk-Recorder has previously on December 5, 1995, adopted the Model Standard Code by incorporation by reference of the terms of title 2, Cal. Code of Regs., § 18730, attached hereto as Exhibit D, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, as the Single Comprehensive Conflict of Interest Code for Local Agencies Identified in Santa Barbara County Resolution No. 95-450, as amended, and hereinafter referred to as the "Single Code".

(4) The following exhibits that set forth designated positions and the disclosure categories for the designated positions, attached hereto as Exhibits C-4, C- 9, C-12, C-16. C-17, C-20, C-21, C-25, C-27, C-28, C-30-A, C-30-B, C-30-C, C-33, C-34, C-37 and C-38, hereby (i) amend in their entirety the corresponding exhibits marked as Exhibits C-4, C- 9, C-12, C-16. C-17, C-20, C-21, C-25, C-27, C-28, C-30-A, C-30-B, C-30-C, C-33, C-34, C-37 and C-38 in the series C Exhibits of said Single Code:

Victoria Street, Santa Barbara, California, or at such other location as is hereinafter designated by the Clerk-Recorder.
