PROJECT TITLE: Post Office Drop Box No Parking Zone and Disabled Parking Space.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Public Works Department installed a post office drop box on Union Avenue in the Old Town Orcutt area of Santa Barbara County. After the installation of post office the drop box, it became apparent that parking restrictions in the area were warranted to provide a safe manner in which to use the new post office drop box. The "No Parking" zone was added as part of the design for the installation of the drop box in addition to a disabled parking space on First Street.

Reasons to support exemption findings: The project is a safety improvement and therefore is contemplated by the CEQA exemption under section 15301. Further, there are no unusual circumstances which would create a possibility that there would be a significant effect. Because this is a public road project outside of the Coastal Zone it has been determined to be exempt from the Land Use Development Permit requirements by ordinance, under Section 35.10.040 G (b) of the Land Use Development Code. The project is public safety activity designed to maintain a safe traveling condition of the highway facility as it was constructed.
