Recommended Actions:

That the Board:

- (1) Make the required CEQA findings for the Santa Ynez River Tamarisk and Arundo Project. Districts 3 and 4.
- (2) Adopt the Project's Mitigated Negative Declaration, and adopt the mitigation monitoring program contained in the conditions of approval. Districts 3 and 4.
- (3) Authorize staff to execute the Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement with the California Dept of Fish and Game (all districts), and provide public notice of the Project as set forth in the Notice of Treatment and Newsletter. Districts 3 and 4.

Summary Text:

The Agricultural Commissioner proposes to use herbicides to remove the California Code of Regulations Section 4500 listed noxious weeds, *Arundo donax* and *Tamarix ramosissima*, from the riparian corridor of the Santa Ynez River, and *Arundo donax* from the riparian corridors of Rincon Creek, Arroyo Burro Creek, and Carpinteria Creek. The benefits of the projects include water quality, flood control, resource management, water conservation and beneficial uses of water for farming and recreation.

The Santa Barbara County Agricultural Commissioner's Office prepared a Mitigated Negative Declaration, (MND) (Attachment B) for the Santa Ynez River Tamarisk and Arundo Project (SYRTAP). The department has surveyed and defined the extent of *Arundo donax* and *Tamarix ramosissima* within the riparian system of the Santa Ynez River from Gibraltar Reservoir to the eastern border of VAFB.

Because of the wide scope of the project, the department conducted an initial study and completed a mitigated negative declaration.

Because funding is not complete for the entire project, the Santa Ynez River Tamarisk and Arundo Project is being implemented in phases. We are starting with the implementation of the treatment of *Arundo donax* along the Santa Ynez River (Phase 1). The treatment of *Tamarix ramosissima* (Phase 2) will not be implemented until additional funding is obtained.

The Board is requested to adopt the Agricultural Commissioner's staff determination that with mitigations, the impact of the Santa Ynez River Tamarisk and Arundo Project is less than significant, by making the required CEQA findings specified in Attachment A and by signing the MND's Notice of Determination included in Attachment B.

Riparian vegetation control requires permitting by the California Department of Fish and Game per Section 1602 of the California Fish and Game Code. The Agricultural Commissioner applied for and obtained a County-wide 1600 Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement (LSAA) (Attachment C).

The Board is requested to approve the Agricultural Commissioner's execution of the Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement (Attachment C).

The Agricultural Commissioner is preparing to implement the Santa Ynez River Tamarisk and Arundo Project by sending a Notice of Treatment (Attachment D) to owners of infested properties. Owners and tenants of properties that are adjacent to the Santa Ynez River, including owners receiving the Notice of Treatment, will be sent the Newsletter about the project (Attachment E).

Background:

The increasing spread of noxious weeds, including tamarisk and arundo is a pressing concern throughout Santa Barbara County, particularly as it relates to water conservation, habitat quality, plant and wildlife biodiversity, and infrastructure protection. *Arundo donax* and *Tamarix ramosissima* are detrimental to native habitat and water conservation and increase the risk of flooding, fire, and erosion in riparian systems. *Arundo donax* and *Tamarix ramosissima* displace native plants, degrade habitat, reduce biodiversity, negatively impact water quality and reduce water availability.

The Santa Ynez River has regional significance as one of the major rivers in the county, serving as a source of water and recreation for county citizens, and as habitat for a number of listed fish and bird species, and is designated as a Critical Coastal Area (CCA). *Arundo donax* treatments are also planned or are continuing in Rincon Creek, Arroyo Burro Creek, and Carpinteria Creek.

Pursuant to the authority established in the California Food and Agriculture Code and the California Code of Regulations, the Agricultural Commissioner is exercising its authority to eradicate the noxious weeds *Arundo donax* and *Tamarix ramosissima* in the riparian corridor of the Santa Ynez River; begin eradication of *Arundo donax* in Rincon Creek; and continue with the eradication of *Arundo donax* in Carpinteria Creek and Arroyo Burro Creek.

The project is funded by grants administered by the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) Proposition 50, the California Department of Fish and Game, the County of Santa Barbara's Coastal Resources Enhancement Fund, and the Coastal Impact Assistance Program.
