The **Social Justice Ministry** of the *Live Oak Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Goleta, CA* fully supports the Planning Commission's decision to deny a permit to Exxon-Mobil to restart oil drilling in the channel and to transport oil by truck on county highways, or by any other means.
