

Proposed Courthouse Fee Structure

- Specific fees for each of the six areas
- Additional hourly rate for private events of \$80
- Bird of Paradise Area lowered from \$425 to \$300
- All day entire grounds fee of \$2500
- 35% discount of daily rate for set-up and break-down
- Community Services Director can charge additional staffing at the current hourly billable rate
- 10% discount for 501(c)(3) Non-profit Organizations
