Santa Ynez Valley Alcohol Licensing Existing Setting

Currently in the unincorporated area of the Santa Ynez Valley, there are:

- □ 186 active alcohol licenses of various types
 - 9 additional licenses pending ABC approval
 - 4 Off Sale licenses (stores)
 - 24 On Sale licenses (bars and taverns, restaurants, hotel)
 - 145 winery licenses

> Application currently covers entire facility; no area limitations



Santa Ynez Valley Alcohol Licensing ABC Process

- □ Although the May 26, 2010 application is technically processed as a premises-to-premises transfer, the practical affect will be a new review of all licensing on the premises
- □ Conditions of operations which exist on current licenses will be re-opened by the ABC
- □ The application is treated by the ABC as a full facility license, which could potentially be constricted through the review and protest process



Santa Ynez Valley Alcohol Licensing Protest Process


- Must meet legal sufficiency requirements as detailed by ABC
- □ Protests should be submitted to the ABC by 6/28/10



Santa Ynez Valley Alcohol Licensing Protest Process (cont.)

□ Grounds of protest include the following:


- The premises is located within the immediate vicinity of a school, church, hospital, or children's playground and the normal operation of the licenses premises would interfere with their functions
- Issuance of the license would result in or add to undue concentration of licenses
- Issuance of the license to the premises would create a law enforcement problem, or aggravate an existing police problem

- □ ABC anticipates analysis will take 7-8 months
- □ Hearing before an administrative law judge expected in Spring 2011
- □ All protestants will be noticed of hearing date
