### Affordable Housing & Federal Funding

History: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funds

#### AFFORDABLE HOUSING

- No more than 30% of the monthly household income for rent and utilities.
- Affordable developments are built for households based on the area median income (AMI).

### Income Limit 4-person household

Extremely Low (30% AMI): \$37,450

Very Low (50% AMI): \$62,450

Low (80% AMI): \$100,050

#### CDBG & HOME

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

• Local communities undertake community development activities ranging from housing and neighborhood revitalization to economic development and infrastructure improvement.

HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)

 Local communities use the funds for a variety of homeownership and rental activities.


