Sheriff's Office and Probation Department



- Request approval for a two-year contract extension with Corizon Health, Inc.
- Contract provides medical, mental health (Sheriff's Office only) and pharmaceutical services to inmates and youth at the Sheriff's and Probation Department facilities.



History



- July 1995 – Sheriff's Office contracted with Prison Health Services (PHS).
- July 2006 – Probation contracted with PHS.
- June 2011 – PHS and Correctional Medical Services merged to form Corizon Health, Inc.
- June 2013 – Board of Supervisors approved Sheriff and Probation's current contract with Corizon Health, Inc. The current contract expires June 30, 2015.



Medical Services Contract



- This is a staff only contract in which Corizon provides qualified staff for a specific number of hours per week as well as on-site services as specified in the contract.
- All pharmaceutical and off site services, which includes hospitalizations and specialty care, are paid for by the Sheriff's Office or Probation Department.

Collaboration and Continuation of Care



- In July of 2013, Corizon Health, Inc. initiated preparations for the National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC) inspection. (Sheriff and Probation)
- Weekly Inmates of Continued Interest meetings.
- Monthly Jail Mental Health Inside/Out meetings.
- Weekly ADMHS Case Conference Call-Ins.
- Accessibility of Corizon Health Service Administrator.



Collaboration and Continuation of Care

(continued)



- Medical personnel provide Probation staff with recurrent and timely trainings, including co-facilitating Trauma training with ADMHS and Probation.
- Assisted in the development of Female Specific programming in the Juvenile Hall.
- Weekly Treatment Team meetings at Juvenile Hall.
- Bi-weekly unit rounds with Probation and ADMHS.
- Successful bi-annual inspections by the Institute of Medical Quality (IMQ) in 2013, and the Board of State Community Corrections (BSCC) in 2014.
