RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING
OCTOBER 2015 AS NATIONAL
CYBER SECURITY AWARENESS MONTH

Whereas, Santa Barbara County recognizes the vital role that the Internet and information technology play in the daily lives of county staff and residents and that internet users and the nation's information infrastructure face an increasing threat of malicious cyber-attack, loss of privacy from spyware and adware and significant financial personal privacy losses due to identify theft and fraud; and

Whereas, The National Association of Counties is encouraging the nation's county governments to enhance their cyber security efforts and encourage their citizens to adopt secure online practices; and

Whereas, The Stop.Think.Connect. Campaign (www.stopthinkconnect.org) is a national effort coordinated by a coalition of private companies, nonprofits and government organizations to raise awareness about cybersecurity among all digital citizens, helping them stay safer and more secure online; and

Whereas, maintaining the security of cyberspace is a shared responsibility in which each of us has a critical role, and awareness of computer security essentials will improve the security of Santa Barbara County's information infrastructure and economy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED AND RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Santa Barbara County does hereby observe the month of October 2015 as National Cyber Security Awareness Month to recognize the importance of cyber security and encourage citizens to engage in safe cyber practices in their homes, schools, workplaces and businesses.
