Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors consider recommendations regarding an Alcohol and Drug Program Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) service contract for FY 09-10, as follows:

- 1. Approve and execute a contract with Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. (not a local vendor) in the amount of \$1,100,000 for the period of July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.
- 2. Authorize the Director of ADMHS to approve amendments to the proposed contract, provided that any such amendments do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the contract's dollar amount.

Summary Text:

The State Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (State ADP) allocates state and federal revenue to counties for the delivery of substance abuse prevention and treatment services and provides reimbursement to counties for such services. In accepting state or federal funds earmarked for alcohol and drug program services, counties are obligated to comply with federal and state laws, regulations and administrative policies specified as a condition of the receipt of funds. Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. provides Narcotic Replacement Therapy, detoxification and individual and group counseling to Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) clients.

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Background:

ADMHS has worked to develop contract exhibits customized to the services offered by its contractors and to comply with the appropriate governing State agency. The contract with Aegis implements changes outlined in ADMHS' ADP contracts board letter of June 23, 2009. It includes elimination of the Provider Workbook, which was developed several years ago as a supplemental document containing program specific and financial detail; this information is now encompassed in the new contract format. Narcotic Treatment Programs, such as the one operated by Aegis, adhere to specific requirements established by the State. The new contract incorporates the State ADP program requirements and includes detailed descriptions of the services, criteria for referral, admission, service authorization and discharge processes.

Aegis Medical Systems, Inc. (Aegis) provides methadone prescribed by a physician to alleviate withdrawal symptoms from narcotics. Aegis also conducts drug screening and provides individual and group counseling to clients. Clients who have substance abuse diagnoses and addictions to opiates receive services that support stabilization, rehabilitation and recovery. Services are provided at Aegis' locations in Santa Maria and Santa Barbara. Aegis provided treatment services to approximately 300 unduplicated clients in FY 07-08.

Approval of the recommended action will provide for the continued availability of these services. The contract with Aegis was completed and submitted to Aegis for review and signature in May 2009. By the time a signed agreement was provided to the County by Aegis, the submission deadline for the July 14 Board hearing had passed. In an effort to ensure Aegis operates under an executed contract, and can continue to provide services in FY 09-10, this item is being submitted as an addition to the July 14 agenda.

Performance Measure:

Approval of the recommended action will assist ADMHS in meeting the following Recurring Performance Measure: to provide alcohol and other drug treatment services to 5,000 adults and youth.
