- ii. Revise Sec. 35-69, "AG II Agriculture II," to add consolidated pipeline terminals as a permitted use;

- v. Revise Sec. 35-157, "Oil and Gas Pipelines," to clarify the applicability of this section to pump stations;
- vi. Revise Sec. 35-158, "Onshore Exploration and/or Production of Offshore Oil and Gas Reservoirs," to eliminate applicability of this section to the Gaviota Planning Area;
- vii. Add a new section 35-159 that prescribes the permitting process and requirements for consolidated pipeline terminals;
- f) Amend the Inland Zoning Ordinance (Article III, Chapter 35, Santa Barbara County Code), revising Sec. 35-296, "Treatment and Processing Facilities," to delete reference to Gaviota as a consolidated oil and gas processing site;
- g) Direct staff to work with the State of California to realize conversion of the GTC site into public recreational use following reclamation of the site as a former oil terminal.
