Subject: ADDENDUM - Final Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Franklin Trail Project,
Carpinteria Area, First Supervisorial District

The City of Carpinteria has partial jurisdiction on the Franklin Trail Project from the beginning of the trail and through the Carpinteria High School property. The City will require a Coastal Development Permit and will use the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) as part of its review for the project. Recent conversation and coordination with City and Parks Division staff has resulted in the City requesting that the Board consider some minor clarifications to the project description and other minor corrections as part of the certification, determination and adoption of the MND at your March 13, 2012 hearing.

Staff has considered and analyzed the proposed clarifications and recommends that the Board include the proposed modifications in your action.

The items to be included are as follows:

- a) Project Description, Page 3, 3rd Paragraph, 3rd sentence:
"The trail is proposed to begin at a staging/parking area which will include signage at Meadow View Lane and Sterling Avenue along Franklin Park within the City of Carpinteria and follow a bikeway north to Foothill Road where the trail would follow along the west and north boundaries of Carpinteria High School. For safety of the student population, the trail through the High School will be fenced on both sides of the trail with chain link except for a short section that will require fencing on only one side of the trail for a total distance of approximately 0.4 miles."
- b) Geologic Processes, Page 26, last Paragraph, 2nd sentence:
"Parts of the historic trail are overgrown and would require brush clearance and resurfacing prior to being made accessible to the public; however trailblazing would result in minimal rates of deposition, erosion or siltation as minimal grading is proposed.
- c) Figures, Figure 4, Photo 1:
"View of the proposed trail looking ~~west~~ east between the Persoon..."
