Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair to execute an Agreement for law enforcement services with the Lompoc Unified School District (\$154,771.20) for School Resource Deputy (SRD) services starting on August 1, 2021 and ending on June 30, 2022;
- b) Authorize the Sheriff to extend the Agreement for two separate one-year extensions and;
- c) Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities or funding mechanisms which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant impact on the environment, and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA guidelines.

Summary Text: The Sheriff proposes that the County enter into a Service Agreement with the Lompoc Unified School District to provide a School Resource Deputy at Cabrillo High School and Maple High School in order to provide a law enforcement presence on the school grounds for the safety of the children, parents, teachers, administrators, and visitors of these schools.

The Agreement includes the provision of one (1) Special Duty Deputy to act as the School Resource Deputy. The duties of the School Resource Deputy will include enforcement of state and local statutes that are primarily related to youth-oriented offenses, and acting as a liaison between law enforcement, school authorities, students, and parents. The School Resource Deputy also ensures the safety of the campus and acts as a first responder to any initial issues that might arise on the campus. At times, the School Resource Deputy will teach classes and conduct training for students and faculty. This Agreement

provides for the School Resource Deputy to be present on campus and provide a quick law enforcement response if needed.

Background:

The Sheriff's Office has historically provided supplemental law enforcement services to the Lompoc Unified School District on a contractual basis. The Agreement will cover all costs of the Deputy Sheriff for duties performed for the Lompoc Unified School District at the annualized cost of a deputy working 1440 hours during the Agreement year.

The Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office Cost Analyst determined the hourly cost of an E-Step "Legacy" Special Duty Deputy including benefits, and the Contract Services Bureau utilized this figure to determine the quoted yearly cost for a School Resource Deputy. For the Lompoc Unified School District, the SRD would work the entire school year, (36 weeks), totaling 1440 hours. The remaining 16 weeks of the year when school is not in session, the SRD would be assigned to work general patrol within the County of Santa Barbara. The primary focus will be to reduce overtime charged to the County for staffing shortages incurred due to vacations, injuries, and other factors.

Fiscal Analysis:

The revenues from the Lompoc Unified School District contract are currently budgeted in the Sheriff's FY2021-22 budget. The cost for the services is included, as the Special Duty Deputy that will perform the task is already hired, trained, and has worked as the SRD at Cabrillo High School (Lompoc). This contract to provide services to a school in the unincorporated area of the county is designed to recover the full salary and benefits cost of the assigned deputy for the portion of the year contracted. This is a one-year contract, concluding on June 30, 2022, with an option to extend for two additional one-year terms.
