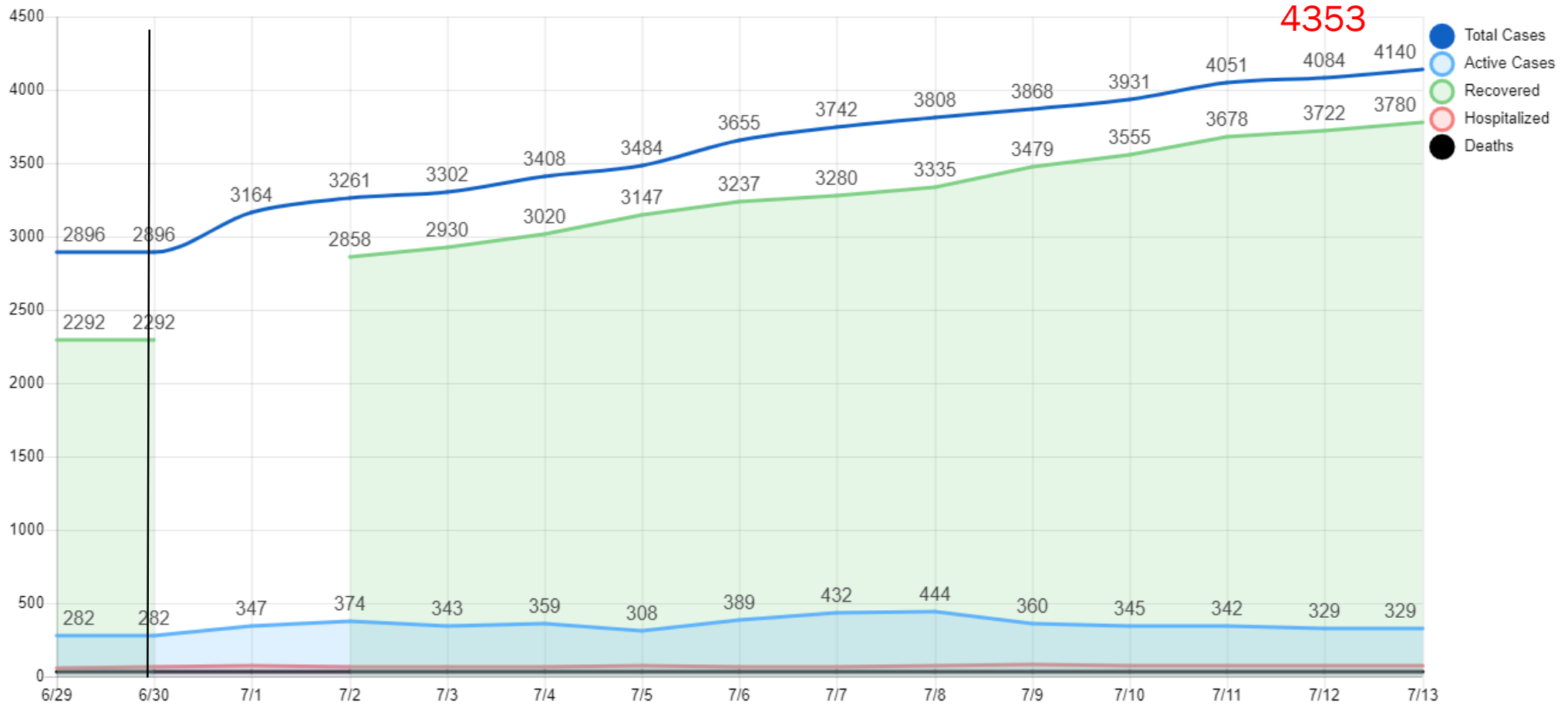

CASE STATUS

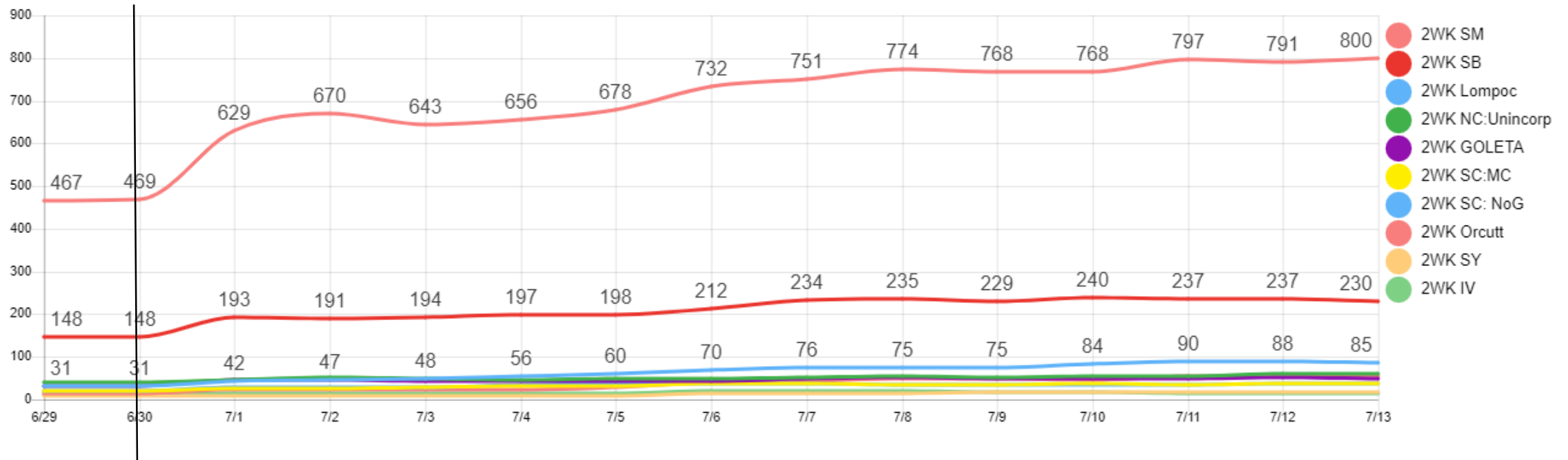


No new data reported for 6/30 due to change in databases used for case investigation

NEW CASES IN PAST 2 WEEKS: City-by-City

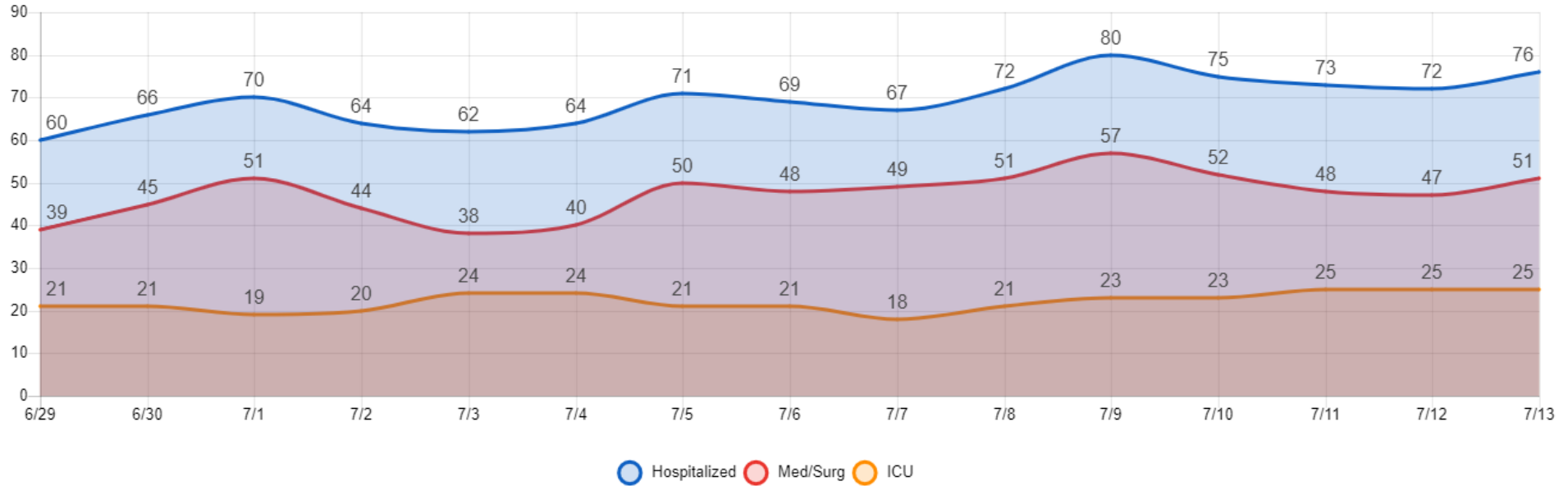

CDPH Monitoring Metrics: Healthcare capacity		
Percent of medical/surgical beds currently available	Moderately Concerning	34.3%
Percent of ICU beds currently available	Less Concerning	38%
Percent of ventilators currently available	Less Concerning	80%
Percent of hospitals with >14 days of PPE on hand	More Concerning	60%

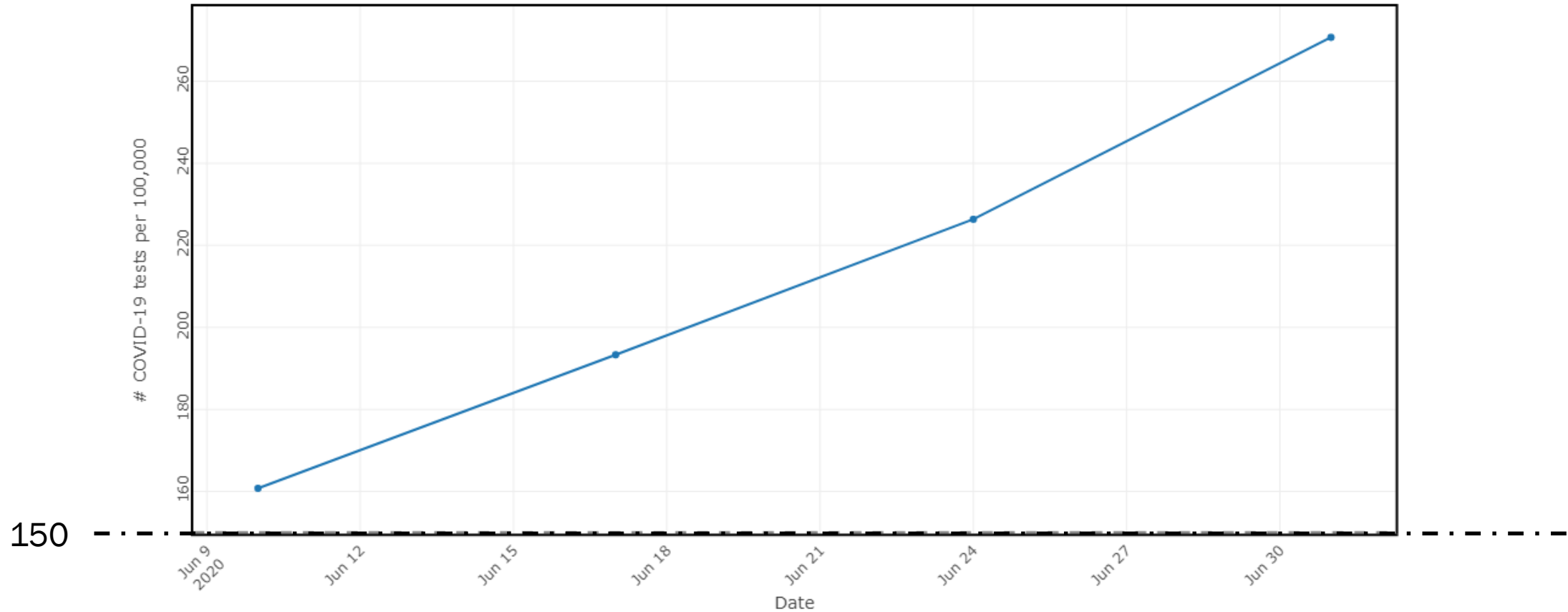

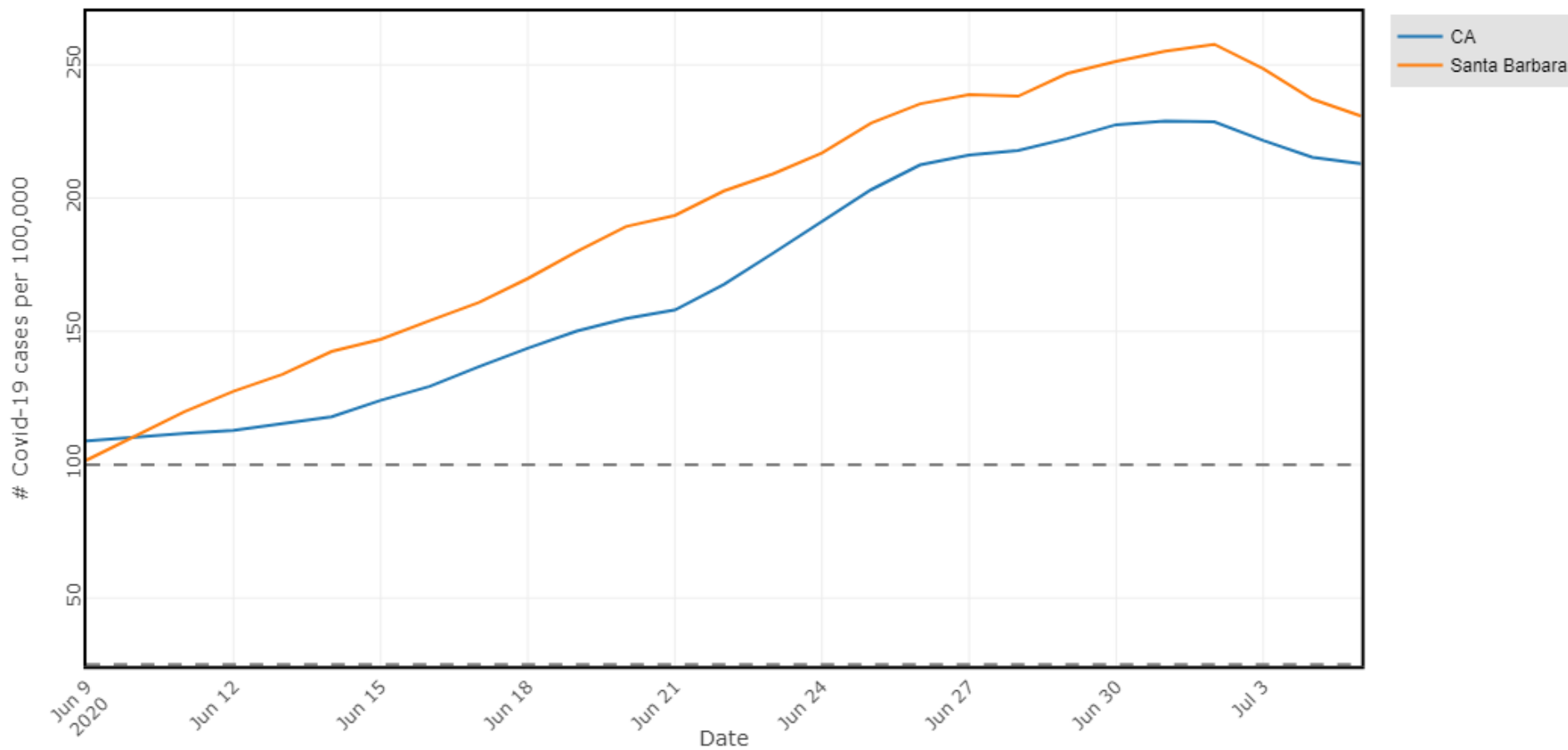
Average Number of Tests per Day

7-Day Average Testing Rate (7 day lag)



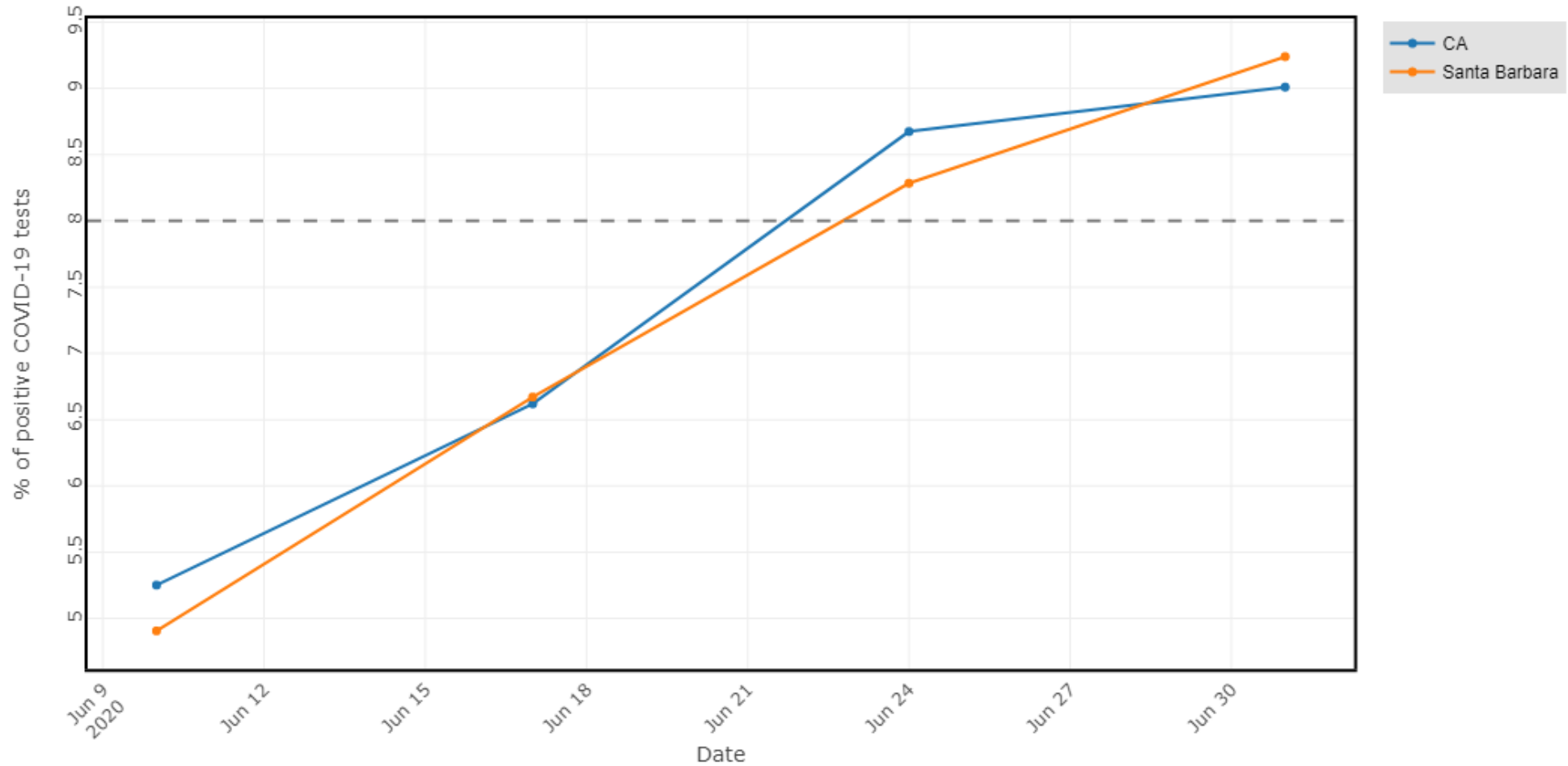
Elevated Disease Transmission

14-day Average Case Rate (3-day lag)



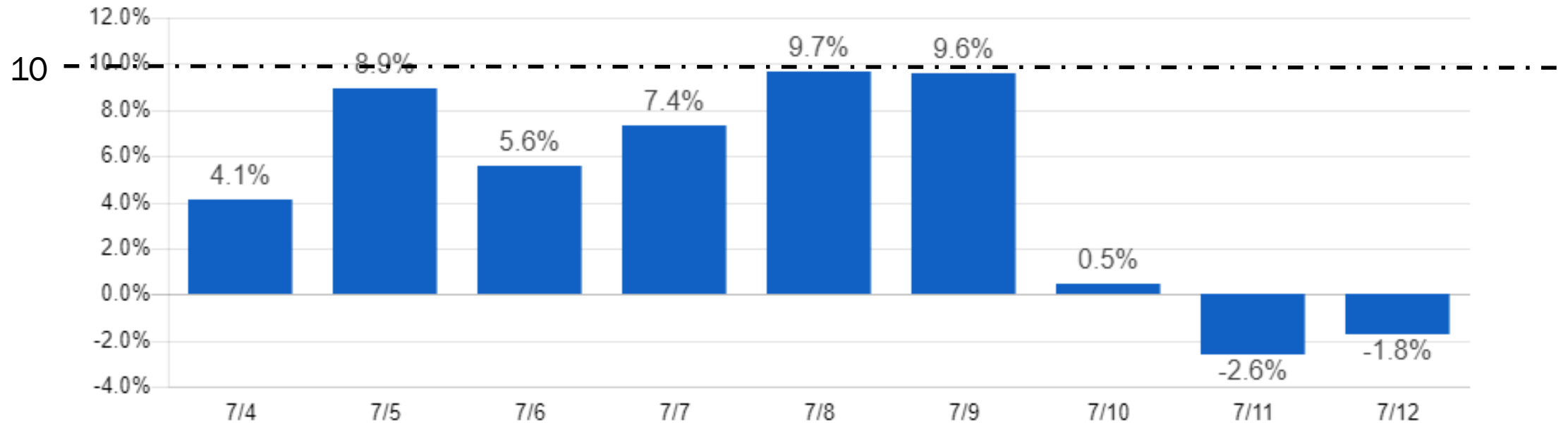

7-Day Testing Positivity (7-Day Lag) for CA, Santa Barbara

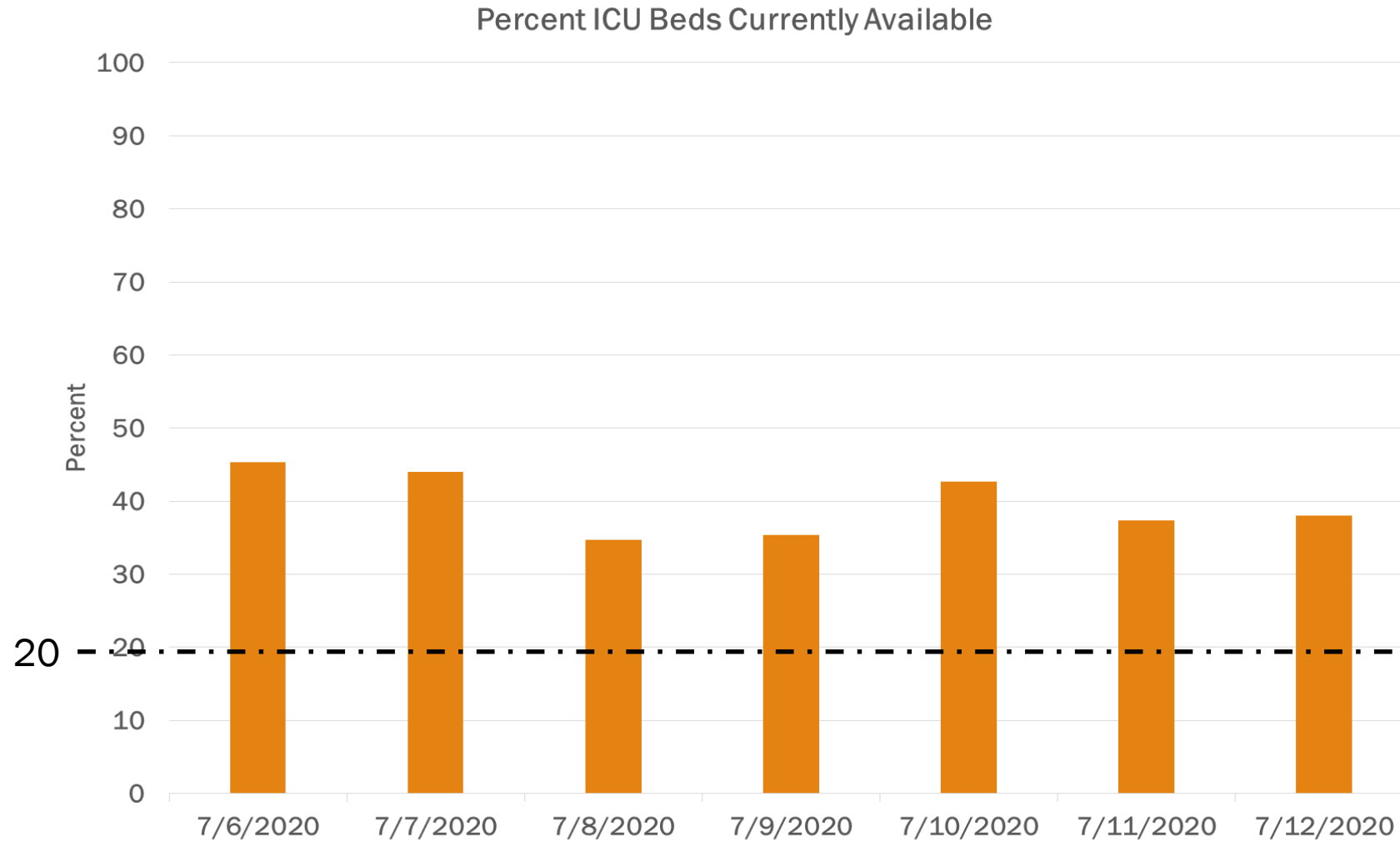


Increasing hospitalization

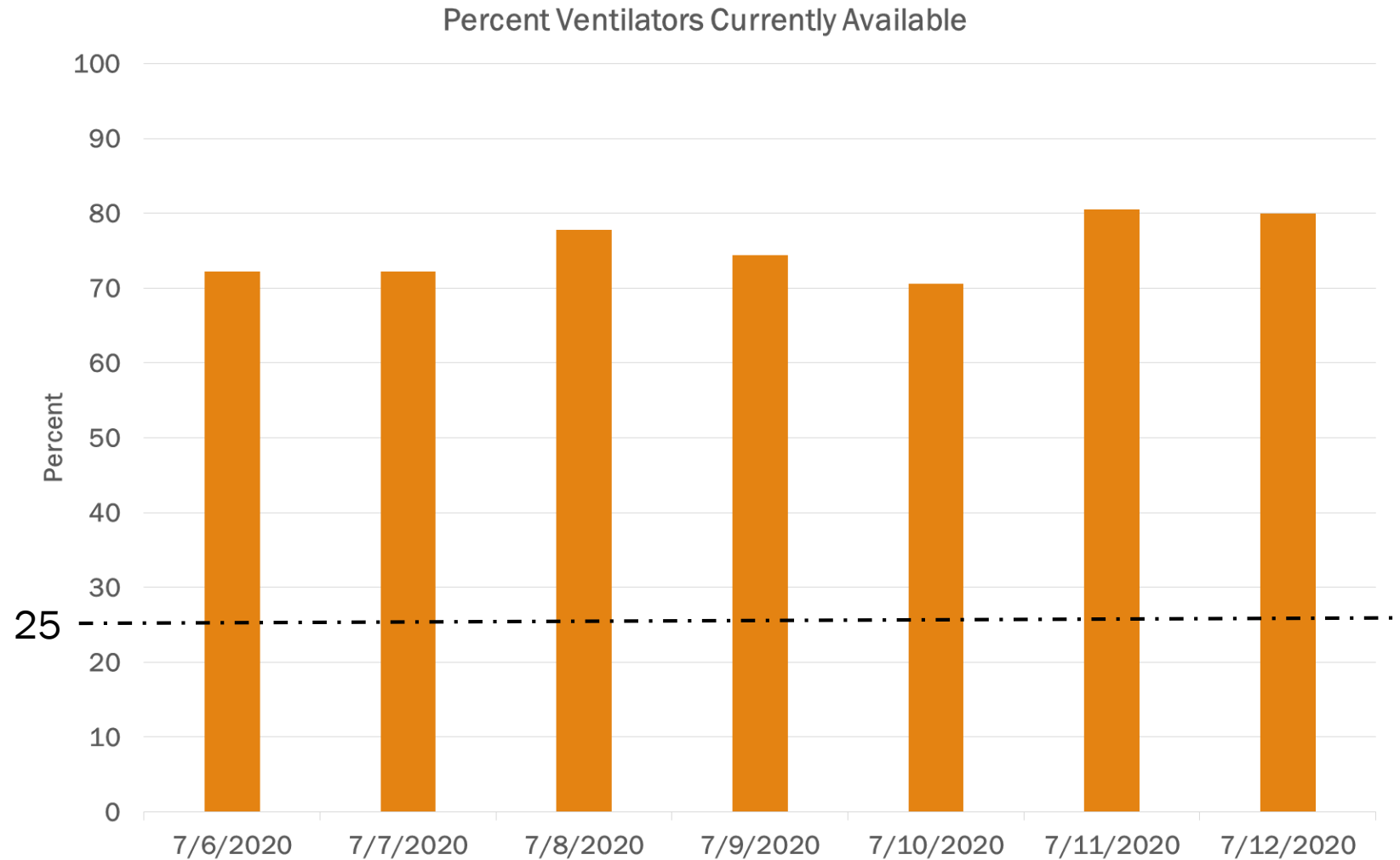
CDPH: % Change in 3-day Average Hospitalizations

Congregate Settings

Congregate Settings-Best Practices

- Environments-close proximity for either a limited or extended period of time
- Shelters (Homeless, Domestic Violence), Skilled Nursing (LTCF), Corrections (Jails/Prisons, Juvenile Institutions), Schools (Dormitories)
- Administrative/Environmental Protocols
 - Temperature/Symptom Screening
 - Physical Distancing
 - Face Coverings
 - Cleaning/Disinfection
- Education



Congregate Settings: Best Practices

- Congregate (residential) vs. Congregate (community)
 - Outbreak Defined
- Confirmed Case/Contact Tracing
- Isolation/Quarantine
- Testing weekly x2
- Surveillance



Congregate Settings: Best Practices

- Reporting to Public Health
- Coordination of Testing
- Coordination of Isolation/Quarantine
- Communications (Internal, External, Public)



New State Orders

New Statewide Order

➤ Close indoor operations:

- Dine-in restaurants
- Wineries and tasting rooms
- Movie theaters
- Family entertainment centers (for example: bowling alleys, miniature golf, and arcades)
- Zoos and museums
- Cardrooms

➤ Bars, brewpubs, breweries, and pubs must close all operations both indoor and outdoor statewide, unless they are offering sit-down, outdoor dine-in meals. Alcohol can only be sold in the same transaction as a meal.



Closure of Additional Indoor Operations for Counties on Monitoring List

- Fitness centers
- Worship services
- Protests
- Offices for non-essential sectors
- Personal care services, like nail salons, body waxing, and tattoo parlors
- Hair salons and barbershops
- Malls
