- 5. Possibility of fees & additional revenue-generating & funding opportunities for Parks.





# Additional Revenue Generating Activities

- Additional Restaurant Concessions at Appropriate Park Locations (Cachuma, Lookout, Rincon, Waller, etc.)
- Luxury Camping additional cabins & yurts (Cachuma & Jalama)
- Sailing, Canoeing & Kayaking (Cachuma & Jalama)
- Special Events Where Sponsor Could be Charged Fees (festivals, concerts, etc.)

# Additional Funding Options

- County Service Areas (CSAs)
- Parks & Open Space Districts
- Increase in Transit Occupancy Tax (TOT)
- Sales Taxes, Parcel Taxes, Utility User Taxes

# Divestiture Strategies

- Municipalization Parks near or in city boundaries could be turned over to cities (e.g., Goleta Beach, Arroyo Burro Beach, Waller Park, Providence Landing Park, Guadalupe Dunes, etc.).
- Privatization Parks could be bid out to private providers to operate.

## County Resident Fee Discount Program

- Public Resources Code (PRC) prohibits resident fee discounts for beach recreation areas (like Jalama).
- Fee discounts could be offered for day use annual passes at Cachuma (annual day use passes are currently available at both Cachuma and Jalama).
- Fee discounts could be offered for regular day use fees, overnight camping & hook-up fees, etc. at Cachuma.
- Logistical issues would arise under current first-come/first-served system (i.e., traffic back-up on Highway 154 to check IDs to verify residence).

# Fee Adjustment Recommendations (as presented to the Board on September 4, 2007):

- Market study warrants adjusting fees at Cachuma & Jalama & the day use group picnic area fees.
- Fees last adjusted in May, 2003 (over four years ago).
- Proposed annual fee adjustments will approximate \$380,000 in ongoing annual fee revenue, which will fund three Parks Budget Expansion Requests.
  - County taking over the management, operation, and maintenance of Rancho Guadalupe Dunes, which is currently under lease to the Center for Natural Lands Management (CNLM) - \$223,500
  - □ Restoration of tree and landscape maintenance services funding that was previously cut from Parks budget \$53,300
  - Ongoing costs of an advance reservation system (proposed to be implemented on a limited basis at Jalama) - \$103,200
    - Auditor-Controller supports acquisition of this system.
    - ■Staff currently evaluating options for system.
    - ■Staff will return to Board with recommendations prior to implementation (including keeping some campsites available on first-come/first-served basis).
