| Channel Islands YMCA | My Home Transitional Living Program | \$24,375 | Partnering with the Housing Authority of the City of Santa Barbra and private landlords to provide access to competitive housing options, My Home provides: needs assessment, financial assistance, case management, counseling, life skills training, and community engagement opportunities. The program's goal is to reduce the incidence of homelessness so youth have a safe place to live, a reliable support system, a sense of purpose and the self-sufficiency skills needed to live independently. | County-wide |
| Channel Islands YMCA | Noah's Anchorage Youth Crisis Shelter | \$25,228 | Noah's Anchorage provides residential and drop-in services to youth 12-21 who are homeless, at-risk for abuse, and/or running away. Noah's is an 8-bed residential home located at 301 West Figueroa Street in Santa Barbara. Residential services and the crisis hotline operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Youth receive shelter, access to basic needs, crisis intervention, mental health counseling, family mediation and care coordination. | County-wide |
| Community Action Commission (DBA CommUnify) | Senior Nutrition Program | \$15,000 | In 2021-22, Senior Nutrition will provide fresh, cooked, nutritious meals to 792 unduplicated low-income seniors countywide in community settings or delivered to homebound, frail seniors. All meals will be delivered until seniors can safely gather. The program provides bilingual nutrition education, social and education programs in congregate settings, and regular wellness checks—crucial assessments, particularly during the COVID-19 crisis. | County-wide |
| De Marillac, LLC dba Fr. Virgil Cordano Center | Fr. Virgil Cordano Center (FVCC) Community Outreach Program | \$20,000 | The FVCC Community Outreach Program is a homeless street outreach program that addresses the urgent physical needs of Santa Barbara's homeless community by providing 300 meals per week and a mobile case management to facilitate access to essential social services, housing navigation, and employment opportunities. | Santa Barbara area |
| Domestic Violence Solutions for Santa Barbara County | DVS Emergency Shelter | \$35,000 | The CDBG funding will be used to support emergency shelter staff who provides client safety, shelter and case management to individuals and their families fleeing domestic abuse. In the past, these funds have been applied to a Santa Barbara shelter client advocate's salary. | County-wide |

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| Friendship Adult Day Care Center Inc. | Adult Day Services Program | \$15,000 | During COVID, the online virtual activity subscription program and care include interactive Zoom classes: adaptive exercise, informative/educational discussions, travel, cooking, arts & crafts, games, comedy, and bingo. Other services include regular care call consultations, Veteran and Caregiver Support groups, memory screenings, deliveries of food, sanitary supplies, Take Care Totes, caregiver hotline, tech support, and a tablet loan program. | South County |
| Good Samaritan Shelter | Bridgehouse Shelter | \$50,000 | Bridgehouse is an Emergency Shelter that serves homeless individuals and families in the Lompoc region. Located just outside the city limits, Bridgehouse provides vital shelter services to a large homeless population in the community. Services include food, shelter, case management, laundry accessibility, medical assessments & referrals, telehealth access for medical and behavioral health appointments, document readiness and housing placement support (including RRH). | Lompoc |
| Interfaith Initiative of Santa Barbara DBA Showers of Blessing | Showers of Blessing | \$20,000 | Showers of Blessing brings free hot showers and love to people experiencing homelessness in South Santa Barbara County in order to promote health and restore dignity to our most vulnerable neighbors. With each shower, guests receive a freshly laundered towel and washcloth, shampoo, soap, a new toothbrush, a new razor and other toiletries, a new pair of cotton socks, a new pair of underwear, a 30-day pack of biodegradable wipes and a hand-sewn mask. | Isla Vista |
| Legal Aid Foundation of Santa Barbara County | Family Violence Prevention Program | \$25,000 | The Family Violence Prevention program provides a civil attorney for survivors of intimate partner violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, and human trafficking. The attorney obtains protective orders, custody orders, and other legal relief for the client. | North County |
| NBCC | Safe Parking Shelter and Rapid Rehousing Program | \$50,000 | The Safe Parking Shelter and Rapid Re-Housing Program provides safe overnight shelter for vehicular homeless persons in Santa Barbara County. Safe Parking also provides rapid rehousing, case management, street outreach, housing navigation and housing retention services, and financial assistance to program shelter clients and the homeless referred through Coordinated Entry, to transition them into, and help them to maintain, secure housing. Program services are provided at no cost to clients. | County-wide |

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| NBCC | Community Counseling Center | \$50,000 | The Donald J. Willfong Community Counseling Clinic provides low-cost mental health counseling and psychological assessments in both English and Spanish on a sliding-scale with no one turned away for inability to pay. The Clinic also hosts a respected clinical training program and provides clinical supervision by licensed volunteers. As of this year our counseling services are available in telehealth format and clients can receive services from their homes while social distancing. | County-wide |
| Organic Soup Kitchen | Basic Needs: Food Security for North County | \$40,600 | There is an overwhelming need for food security and premium nutrition in the northern region of Santa Barbara County. Currently, the residents do not have access to nutritional services and are facing significant financial challenges. Several north county agencies have requested SoupMeals for their seniors and immunocompromised residents or clients. This expansion into north county has the potential of serving about 1,000 community members each week which is more than double our current clients. | County-wide (expansion to North County) |
| PATH (People Assisting the Homeless) | Community Navigator Case Manager | \$55,000 | County of Santa Barbara CDBG Public Service funds will support PATH Santa Barbara's full-time community navigator case manager who provides intensive case management, service referrals, and housing placement to individuals experiencing homelessness. The role liaises with the City of Santa Barbara Restorative Court, Santa Barbara Police Department, Coordinated Entry System (CES) partners, and others to help the most vulnerable receive supportive services and achieve stability in permanent homes. | County-wide, South County focus |
| Peoples' Self-Help Housing Corporation | Camino Scholars' Orcutt Learning Center, Serving English Language Learners from Low-Income Households | \$15,000 | Camino Scholars operates eleven learning centers located at our affordable housing properties, including the learning center at Mariposa Townhomes in Orcutt. We serve English language learners and students from low-income households who attend after each of the 180 school days per year, plus an additional 40 days. We also operate College Club which assists the same demographic with college enrollment and retention, starting in high school until students complete their final college degree. | Orcutt Union School District |

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| Sanctuary Centers of Santa Barbara Inc. | Integrated Care Clinic Serving Youth | \$25,000 | Integrated Care Clinic Serving Youth is an expansion of the current integrated medical, dental and behavioral health care that is provided at Sanctuary's Integrated Care Clinic. With this new expansion of child psychiatry, grant funding will provide for free psychiatry for children, a dedicated space for children's services, therapeutic equipment/materials and free child psychiatric and mental health services for one year. | County-wide (majority South County) |
| Santa Maria Valley FISH - Meals on Wheels Santa Maria Valley | Meals on Wheels - Santa Maria Valley | \$20,000 | Meals on Wheels SMV Volunteer Drivers will deliver a two part nutritious meal (medically specific on request) 5 days a week, holidays included, between the hours of 11:30 am and 1:00 pm. We will also perform a informal health and welfare check when we deliver the meal. Our meal consists of a warm entrée dish with a protein, starch and vegetable and a cold sack with a salad, fruit, and bread, delivered in 100% earth friendly containers. | Orcutt |
| Santa Ynez Valley People Helping People | Basic Needs Services for Seniors | \$23,796 | PHP's Basic Needs Services for Seniors provides a comprehensive system of care and after-care for low-income seniors that includes case management, health and mental wellness care, providing nutritious food, clothing, essential household items, housing assistance, utility assistance, referrals to mainstream benefits, connections and transportation. | Santa Ynez Valley |
| Santa Ynez Valley Senior Citizens Foundation | Meals on Wheels | \$20,000 | This grant will fund 2,860 delivered meals to 100 low-income home-bound seniors. Funds will pay for food purchases, and direct wages. This will fund Buellton, Los Alamos, and Santa Ynez seniors. | Santa Ynez Valley |
| Sarah House Santa Barbara | Sarah House | \$15,000 | Sarah House provides individual bedrooms in an eight-bedroom home. Our Mission is to provide hospice care for those of our County who are low income. 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| St. Vincent's Institution | Family Strengthening Program (FSP) | \$20,000 | St. Vincent's Family Strengthening Program (FSP) provides essential services to homeless, single and/or pregnant at-risk mothers and their children (ages 0-5) by offering up to 27 months of on-site transitional housing, case management, behavioral health services, parenting counseling, job skills training, and early childhood education. | County-wide (focus on South County) |
| Standing Together to End Sexual Assault | Sexual Assault Counseling and Education in Isla Vista (SACE IV) | \$25,000 | SACE IV strives to mitigate the trauma of sexual assault and works toward the elimination of sexual violence. The Isla Vista community has been the scene of some high profile cases of sexual violence and violence against women. UCSB students have various resources; however, there is a larger community in Isla Vista who would benefit from SACE IV. STESA will focus on serving individuals who are not connected to UCSB, such as, Santa Barbara City College students and families. | Isla Vista |
| The Salvation Army | Homeless Program | \$25,000 | The homeless program runs throughout the week and we have had an increase of homeless. Meaning more resources to be needed for the hot meals. Also we provide blankets and the necessities we can provide to help in there day to day life. | County-wide |

Power Hour tracks students' progress in attendance and achievement in literacy and math. CALM will also promote recovery from traumas such as abuse, domestic violence, and household dysfunction through Childhood Trauma Treatment which provides individual and family therapy using nationally recognized modalities for addressing childhood trauma. | Carpinteria |
