Summary:					
On April 9, 2006, the Civil Grand Jury released a report on Measure D, which authorizes a one-half cent increase in sales tax to be devoted to transportation improvements and which is scheduled to sunset in March 2010. The report concludes that the accomplishments under Measure D justify the continuation of a transportation sales tax and includes 5 findings and 3 recommendations. On June 8, the Public Works Department responded to Findings 2 and 5 and Recommendation 1 as required by the Grand Jury. It is recommended that the Board adopt the response of the Public Works Department as its response to the Grand Jury report.
