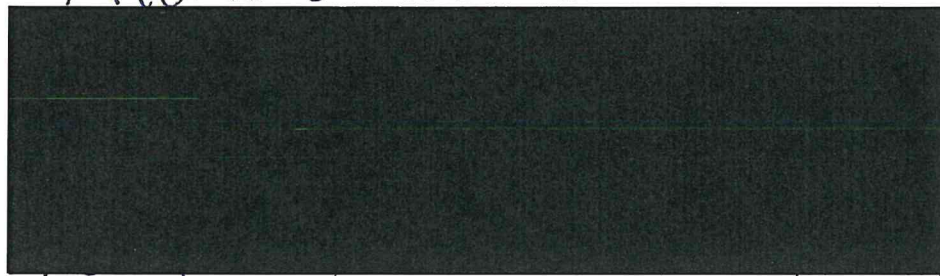
Would like to see some town hall meetings since our democracy is dying and you're all not meeting with the voters on any level so what are you waiting for?

I am writing this correspondence to you regarding the Santa Barbara County Law Libraries. That is, I adamantly maintain that the two (2) Santa Barbara Law Libraries are critically deficient. Indeed, Santa Barbara County's two libraries combined are approximately 1/12 of the size of the Ventura County

Law Library. I recognize that the population of Santa Barbara County is approximately 53% of the population of Ventura County, but based upon population our Law Libraries should be at least one-half of the size of the Ventura Law Library.

Moreover, Law Libraries are more important now than any time in California history back to 1850 when our State was founded. Additionally, with the high cost of Professional Legal Representation, it is vital that Counties in California as well as all of America to have substantial access to Legal Research. Most attorneys have West Law or another firm to perform their Legal Research, but the cost for most citizens is prohibitive.



Please consider advocating the expansion of both the Santa Barbara and Santa Maria Law Libraries.
