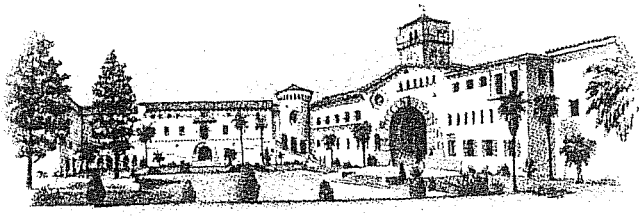

WHEREAS, other serious diseases, such as whooping cough and influenza, continue to affect the health of our families and communities; and

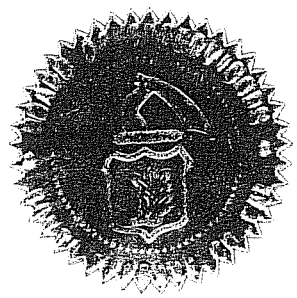
WHEREAS, parents and guardians need to protect children's health by ensuring timely receipt of all childhood vaccines; and
