HEARING - Consider recommendations regarding prohibition of unauthorized use of County-owned property such as immigration enforcement; Safeguard the integrity of County-administered elections and the protection of ballots once they are cast and Evaluate, where legally permissible, to prohibit immigration detention or enforcement facilities within the unincorporated County

As an active protector of our neighbors, I patrol the streets of Goleta and also our SB County jail. This past week, ICE agents were at the jail EVERY DAY M-F to take someone who was released from the jail lobby. On one day a person from our own Probation Department arrived with ICE, placed ankle bracelets on the person and then left, releasing the person to ICE agents. I am a witness to the brutality that ICE kidnappings can be. One day I saw ICE agents chase a released person across the parking lot til he scaled the fence topped with razor wire back into the jail. This person was seriously injured, taken to the hospital and then charged with trespassing.

ICE has NO PLACE on any of our county properties without presentation of a JUDICIAL WARRANT. Please add this to the above proposal: that immigration enforcement on county property requires a PROPERLY EXECUTED JUDICIAL WARRANT.

This message is in reference to Special Agenda Item 1, No. 26-00347, the Capps-Lee proposal concerning federal immigration enforcement and election interference.

I am a 32-year Santa Barbara resident, currently residing at 26 West Constance Ave, in Santa Barbara, 93105. I fully support the prudent and forward-facing proposal put forward by Supervisors Capps and Lee. The proposal recognizes the dangers to public safety and the rule of law posed by ICE and by ongoing efforts by the current federal administration to interfere with states' constitutionally mandated management of elections. My own experience during the 2025 special state election (for redistricting) can illustrate how easily election interference can occur (and how accountability can be erased). In early October 2025, the week during which ballots were mailed to voters, our mail carrier decided — as they apparently have the discretion to do — that my address was uninhabited, due to a lockbox on the door (placed there while renovation work was completed). When I questioned the carrier, she stated that her supervisor had instructed her to stop delivery at my address. I then spoke with the local USPS supervisor who confirmed that delivery had been suspended but, contrary to the USPS's own published policy, undelivered mail had not been held at the post office nor had notice been placed at my residence. Instead, the mail had been returned to senders. That representative as well as the customer service representative whom I contacted could offer no explanation of the lapse. I was able to obtain a new ballot from the County Elections Office and vote, but had I not realized that the ballot was missing and taken action, I would never have received the ballot in time to vote by mail. I believe that our mail-in voting system is secure, but my experience — which could simply have been a weird coincidence — illustrates how federal agencies (USPS) could be complicit in apparently legal manipulation.
