These mothers and daughters also learned how to swim! This was a very empowering thing to see... and be a part of. Our community pool provided a safe environment for all families. I do not think I need to tell you all the details of how this pool was an asset to our whole community: swim lessons, relief from the heat, water aerobics, PE classes from the high school, families, babies, children of all ages, teachers, students, elderly residents, firefighters, private parties, Booster Club movie night and swim... and so much more!!!

I am distressed and disgusted to hear you are considering **not** rebuilding this asset to our community. **Shame on you!!!** Yes, Cuyama is small, rural, and low-income. No, we are not a tourist destination, nor do we have high incomes, or a large voting-voice. These are the reasons *you should be fighting for the project you started*. The money has been paid, as well as the insurance that promised to fix what was broken.
