SUBJECT: Waiver of Fees for BEACON
South Central Coast Beach Enhancement Program (SCCBEP)

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors sitting as both Board of Supervisors and Board of Directors of SBCFCWCD:

1. Waive all County fees, in an estimated amount of \$8500.00, to BEACON for a Coastal Development Permit/Development Plan (CDP) and related work for the BEACON South Central Coast Beach Enhancement Program.
2. Approve budget revision requests transferring funds from the Parks Department and SBC Flood Control and Water Conservation District to fund one half, each, of the costs charged by the Planning and Development Department for permit processing.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The South Central Coast Beach Enhancement Program is consistent with the following adopted Strategic Goals:

- A high quality of life for all residents.
- A community that is economically viable and sustainable.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

Board Resolution 02-213 paragraph 3 authorizes the Board to waive Planning & Development fees by minute order in appropriate cases for good cause. Other BEACON member agencies (Oxnard, Port Hueneme

and Ventura) have waived permit fees for SCCBEP program. Parks Department and Flood Control have agreed to fund from existing departmental funds the “backfill” of the fees waived for BEACON.
