


Context

Tax Collection and Reporting

- Collected \$835K in cannabis gross tax receipts in Q1
- Collections were higher than Q1 last year
- The FY 2024-25 adopted budget is \$6.1 M

Tax Collection, Reporting and HdL Audits

- 2022-23 preliminary audit reports were reviewed internally and one audit has been finalized; second audit is still pending
- HdL is preparing to start six cultivation audits in current fiscal year to complement compliance work
- The Board authorized \$132k in the current year's budget to assist with funding the audits.


