SUBJECT: Initiation of the Annexation of Harp Springs (TM 14,478) into County Service Area 5

Fourth Supervisorial District

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

A. Adopt the attached resolution initiating proceedings to annex territory (Harp Springs Tract 14,478 on APN 103-200-026) in to County Service Area 5.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation(s) are primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

Until 1994, County Service Area 5 (CSA 5) provided for both streetlighting and open space maintenance. At that time, streetlighting lighting functions from CSA 5 were consolidated with the other lighting districts in the northerly part of the county to form the North County Lighting District. CSA 5 now exclusively provides for open space maintenance of approximately 79 acres including a portion of Waller County Park. Funding is provided by a portion of the 1% property tax on tax rolls allocated to open space maintenance. Although no allotment from the 1% property tax is allocated from parcels created in recent years, annexation in to CSA 5 is still recommended in the event the Board of Supervisors wishes to allocate a portion of the property tax to open space maintenance an in order to maintain coterminous boundaries with the North County Lighting District.

Subject: Annexation in to County Service Area 5

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The Harp Springs tract is located south of Clark Avenue and east of Harp Road in the Orcutt area. The land is currently undeveloped and is identified as Key Site 8 in the Orcutt Community Plan and is zoned planned residential development (PD/PRD). There are 44 single family homes proposed for the site. The tract is included within the Orcutt Community Facilities District (CFD) and is being assessed for additional open space maintenance functions. The annexation proceedings will follow the procedures of the Santa Barbara Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO) pursuant to the Cortese/Knox/Hertzbert Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, commencing with Section 56000 of the California Government Code.

Mandates and Service Levels:

The Planning Commission approved Harp Springs Tract 14,478 on May 8, 2002. An appeal of the Planning Commission's approval was denied by the Board of Supervisor's on April 8, 2003.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

No additional revenues or allocations from property taxes will be created by this action.
