WHEREAS, Salary Resolution No. 09-223 established a Classification and Compensation Plan, and authorized Departmental Position Allocations effective July 17, 2009; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Supervisors finds that there is good cause for amending said Resolution No. 09-223, as amended, in the manner provided in this Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Resolution No. 09-223, adopted by the Board on July 14, 2009, is hereby amended by amending those portions identified below to read as follows, effective June 16, 2015:

Section 6. Specialized Duties

ALLOWANCES – The following allowances shall be paid only upon the written certification by the Department Head to the Human Resources Director of the names of the eligible employees.

a. Employee(s) who are regularly assigned legally appointed duties of the Health Officer, as authorized by the Department Head shall be paid an additional allowance of ten percent (10%) of the basic salary assigned to their classification. The number of employees assigned to such specialized duties shall not at any time exceed the number authorized herein:

Public Health	Staff Physician	1


2. Except as amended by this Resolution, Resolution No. 09-223, as amended, shall continue unchanged and in full force and effect.
