WHEREAS, nurses provide preventative or restorative health care to people of all ages, diverse backgrounds and in varied clinical settings in Santa Barbara County, and

WHEREAS, the theme for National Nurse's Week 2004, "Nurses: Your Voice, Your Health, Your Life" in celebration of the ways in which registered nurses and public health nurses strive to provide safe and high quality patient care and map out the way to improve our health care system, and therefore be it

RESOLVED, that it is hereby ordered and proclaimed that this Board of Supervisors does observe the sixth day of May 2004, as National Nurse's Day and May sixth through May twelfth, 2004 as National Nurse's Week in recognition of the contribution of all nurses in the County of Santa Barbara, and therefore be it
