1	Title and brief description of the festival.		<p>The Isla Vista Community Services District (IVCSD) typically hosts the spring community festival each year (beginning in 2022), strategically scheduled during Deltopia. Our community festival aims to provide safe spaces during this weekend to celebrate local culture while promoting accessible harm reduction resources. By combining local art, entertainment, and safety resources, we encourage community engagement and promote public safety. This year, the IVCSD is facilitating the next evolution: a sanctioned, community-built, safety-driven community wide effort. We aim to keep the vibrant spirit of Deltopia alive while reducing harm and strengthening partnerships between students, residents, local businesses, and service providers. Spring Fest (Name TBD) is a multi-zone festival that centers music, art, and community while creating safer, more intentional spaces for celebration. With decreased police presence in activation zones, increased on-site safety resources, and curated entertainment led by local organizations, this event is designed to be the future of celebration in Isla Vista. We hope this sanctioned festival will continue as a form of economic development for Isla Vista like Fiesta or Summer Solstice is for our neighbors in Santa Barbara.</p>

Designate a chief and an assistant chief security guard and file their names and local addresses with the CEO and sheriff. Chief and assistant chief shall be constantly in attendance and keep the sheriff constantly informed of their whereabouts.	This event will contract the Guardians and Garrison security teams to execute the safety of event attendees. There will be 23 stationed security guards and 26 roaming security guards with 1 security lead roaming between all sites. Roaming security guards will be designated to specific site zones and be responsible for crowd control, ensuring local laws and regulations are followed, conflict management, de-escalation, and directing community members to first aid tents as needed. Stationed security guards will be responsible for communicating crowd management needs, ensuring local laws and regulations are followed, de-escalation, performer safety, and communication to law enforcement or 911 as needed. Security guards will be a mix modality of harm reduction ambassadors experienced in managing festival crowds and high level licensed security officers. Harm reduction ambassadors will be identified in purple uniforms and will perform de-escalation techniques without hands on restraints. If a situation escalates, security officers will perform hands on restraints to return to a safe equilibrium for all parties involved. If a situation continues to escalate, security personnel will escort individuals to police tables for further enforcement. Security personnel will be briefed by law enforcement on which scenarios will require police intervention.

As we have a maximum capacity of 9,000 attendees, we anticipate to have about 4,500 gallons of water across all sites. Water will be distributed in 5 gallon containers (or distributed in water cans) with safety stations, police tables, first aid tents, and entertainment zone support staff providing compostable cups and pouring water into them for attendees. Attendees will not be restricted to one cup of water per visit and can continue to get water throughout the day at different zones. If an attendee brings their own enclosed water bottle, staff will fill up their water bottle for them. There a total of 16 different water stations attendees can receive free water from.

Safety stations are defined as tables with free water and pre-packaged snacks people can take as they walk by. Safety stations also include: charging stations, student safety escorts home, and a place people can sit and rest if needed. Safety stations are staffed by Student Safety Partner (SSPs -UCSB Police affiliated), UCIV (student staff, non-police affiliated), and volunteers. First Aid Stations are defined as a place to receive basic first aid from EMT professionals. EMTs will be a mix of external contracted staff from Safety Consulting Services LLC and internal staff provided by LEMSA. There will be a minimum of 3 trained EMTs at each first aid location. First aid stations can provide life saving care (narcan, CPR, etc.) if necessary after calling 911 and while waiting for services. All medical facilities are instructed to call or text 911 if an attendee is in need of more than basic first aid or a place to rest. There will be a total of 12 EMTs throughout the event site with one EMT supervisor from Safety Consulting Services LLC and one internal supervisor provided by LEMSA. A request for the continuation of a Recovery Center provided by Good Samaritan Sobering Center staff and funded by SB County’s CEO office will be in effect for additional services within the IV Community Center. However, if funding is not provided, the community center will be a “sanctuary” space led by the Guardians team to provide support for attendees under the influence of mind-altering substances. If there are any medical needs for the community center, all personnel are instructed to call and wait for 911 services.</p>

Fire risk mitigation is focused on cooking operations, temporary structures, stage production, generators, alcohol service zones, and dense crowd areas. Fire extinguishers (ABC and Class K) will be placed at: all stages and production areas, generator and electrical distribution points, food preparation zones, beer garden and alcohol service areas, command, operations, and first aid locations. No unauthorized open flames, fireworks, or pyrotechnics will be permitted. IVCSD will ensure cooking and vendor controls including: all food vendors operate under valid permits and Fire Department standards, propane tanks secured, inspected, and positioned away from public access, class K extinguishers required at grease-producing cooking stations. IVCSD will brief all staff and partners on electrical and generator safety: generators placed away from tents, trees, and high-density crowd areas, fuel stored in approved containers only, refueling occurs only when powered off and cooled, and all equipment is monitored by trained event operations staff. All temporary structures and tents will be made from flame-retardant materials required where applicable, structures will be professionally anchored and weighted, and exit routes will be maintained and kept unobstructed by security staff. Security staff will ensure continuous emergency access is maintained on: Pardall Road, Madrid Road, Embarcadero del Mar and Norte, Seville Road, Trigo Road, People’s Park perimeter. For evacuation and crowd control: each activation zone will maintain clear exit pathways, People’s Park, Little Acorn Park, and Perfect Park serve as a large open evacuation refuge area, security will redirect crowds and maintain calm evacuation flow, and stage teams will be prepared to pause programming and assist in emergency messaging.</p>

Trash generated in public spaces will be bagged and placed to the nearest bin. On April 5th, the IVCSO leads a litter pick up across all of Isla Vista - including in the festival zone. If there is any trash not placed in the bin at the end of the day, it will be picked up and taken to the dump by IVCSO. Bathrooms, banners, and large stage structures will be removed on Monday morning April 6th. The entire festival will be cleaned up by 10am on Monday April 6th.
