<u>Recommended Actions:</u> That the Board of Supervisors adopt a resolution authorizing certain employees to execute an application and documents on behalf of the Santa Barbara Operational Area for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance through the Federal Fiscal Year 2011 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP).

<u>Summary Text:</u> The Federal Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is providing financial assistance directly to the states to enhance the capability of local units of government to prevent, deter, respond to, and recover from incidents of terrorism and other emergencies. The State then provides this funding to the Santa Barbara Operational Area via the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) for Federal Fiscal Year 2011.

This federal grant has assisted the Operational Area in the purchase of a variety of vital equipment for emergency response agencies throughout the Operational Area, including an armored response vehicle, computer software and hardware for emergency operations centers throughout the Operational Area, bomb squad vehicle, bomb robot and personal protective equipment, mobile command response vehicles, interoperable communication equipment, Reverse-911 hardware and software, hazardous materials detection and decontamination equipment, and medical mass-casualty response equipment. The grant has also funded training activities for fire, hazardous materials, public health, law enforcement, and emergency management agencies.

Background:

The Santa Barbara Operational Area consists of the county and all governmental subdivisions within the county, including the eight incorporated Cities and numerous Special Districts. The Santa Barbara Operational Area qualifies for a grant referred to as the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSPG).

The Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) is a continuing program that would provide funding to the Santa Barbara Operational Area for planning, equipment, training, exercise, and management/administrative purposes. The FFY2011 HSGP is a continuation of annual funding that began with the FY1999 State Domestic Preparedness Equipment Program. Pending equipment purchases for the upcoming grant cycle will include equipment consistent with an ongoing priority to enhance communication, response and recovery capabilities for agencies throughout the Santa Barbara Operational Area.

Performance Measure:

The County is designated as the Santa Barbara Operational Area for emergency planning and response. The California Emergency Management Agency requires Operational Areas throughout the State to act as lead agencies and as coordinators/facilitators of the Homeland Security Grant Program. While the County is not mandated to obtain all available grant funding, it is advisable to take advantage of the funding provided through this grant program. This year, the HSGP is a fully funded grant program with no matching funds required. In addition, 5% of the total funding may be used to cover management and administrative costs associated with facilitation of the grant.

<u>Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:</u> This resolution and Board authorization allows the Santa Barbara County Office of Emergency Services to apply for and file reimbursement claims under the Homeland Security Grant Program. A subsequent budget revision will come to the Board should the department receive funding.
