Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Contractor on Payroll with Martha Yepez as the Cuyama Valley Family Resource Center Coordinator for a total contract amount not to exceed \$78,757.74 for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.(the "Agreement")(Attachment 1); and
- b) Determine that the execution of the Agreement is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to the CEQA Guidelines Section 15061 (b) (3), finding that the execution of the Agreement is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to approve the agreement with Martha Yepez. As the Family Resource Center Coordinator, Martha Yepez, provides professionally-based case management, information, referral, and family support education to families in the greater Cuyama Valley. She also works on developing resources and services for families and children in New Cuyama.

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Operations of the center and the coordinator are supported by the Department of Social Services and First 5 Santa Barbara. First 5 funds have been renewed for Fiscal Year 15/16. This Agreement contains a clause that allows for termination for any reason by the County with 30 days notice.

Background:

In July of 2006, the Department of Social Services agreed to take on the development and operation of a Family Resource Center (FRC) in the Cuyama Valley with some financial support by the Santa Barbara County First 5 Commission. Martha Yepez, who had been providing services to Cuyama families under the auspices of Catholic Charities, was retained by the Department of Social Services as the Family Resource Center Coordinator to take the lead in establishing a community-based family resource center.

The center became fully operational in March of 2007. As the number of residents in need of these services has increased over the past few years to an average of 150 residents per month, a larger facility to accommodate these services was needed. The FRC was relocated to a County facility located at 4689 Highway 166, unit B in New Cuyama.

The current set-up, with the Department of Social Services providing management and operational support and retaining the Coordinator position as a Contractor on Payroll, functions well to provide the needed services and allows the County the most flexibility in the management and support of the program and this position as listed in Attachment 2, Cuyama Family Resource Center Table of Services.

Narrative:

The cost of the Contract on Payroll position is approximately \$78,757.74 annually and will be funded from a \$48,987 grant from the Children and Families Commission and \$29,770.74 in local funds. Appropriations, revenue and local funds for this Agreement have been included under the Social Programs Division, Kids Network sub-division of the Department's FY 2015/16 requested budget.

Key Contract Risks: The risk assessment worksheet has been completed. DSS has had a positive and productive relationship with Martha Yepez. DSS is confident of Martha Yepez's abilities to continue as the Family Resource Center Coordinator through June 2016.
