Dear Mr. Pond:

The Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office protests the unconditional issuance of the above-referenced application on the grounds that it will aggravate existing law enforcement problems at or around the Chumash Casino. The Sheriff's Office will consider withdrawal of the protest upon imposition of conditions agreeable to this office. Those conditions to which I am agreeable are as follows:

- 1. There will be no sales, service or consumption of alcoholic beverages on the gaming floor or at the area designated on the ABC-257 diagram as the "Café."
- 2. There will be no sales, service or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the area identified as the "showroom" (by the form 257) when Class II gaming is in process. Alcoholic beverage sales, service and consumption shall be allowed in the "showroom" during events when restaurant or banquet style meals are provided, as defined by Section 23038 B&P.
- 3. Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages in the hotel, other than in individual guest rooms, will be restricted to overnight hotel guests and shall be in conjunction with the service of restaurant or banquet style meals, as defined by Section 23038 B&P.
- 4. The sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off the premises is strictly prohibited.
 - The quarterly gross sales of alcoholic beverages shall not exceed the gross sales of food during the same period. The licensee shall at all times maintain records which reflect separately the gross sales of food and the gross sales of alcoholic beverages of the licensed business. Said records shall be kept no less frequently than on a quarterly basis and shall be made available to the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control on demand.

- 6. The parking lot of the premises shall be equipped with lighting of sufficient power to illuminate and make easily discernible the appearance and conduct of all persons on or about the parking lot.
- 7. The subject alcoholic beverage license shall not be exchanged for a public premises type license nor operated as a public premises.
- 8. The licensee will comply fully and submit to Section 25755 B&P, in that, all peace officers as defined in California Penal Code sections 830.1 and 830.2, during the scope of their employment as peace officers, may visit and inspect the premises when the licensee is exercising their license privileges.
- 9. The licensee and their employees shall insure that alcoholic beverages are only sold and/or served to persons who are 21 years old or older, and that any person under the age of 21 shall not be permitted to consume alcoholic beverages on the premises.
- 10. The licensee will assure that all alcoholic beverage sales staff receives appropriate training in the sale and handling of alcoholic beverages such as offered by the Department in the LEAD program.
- 11. The licensee will not sell, deliver, or allow consumption of alcohol before or after the legal hours of sale.
- 12. The sale, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall only be allowed on the premises between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and midnight on Sunday through Thursday and from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.
- 13. There shall be no "Happy Hours" when alcoholic beverages are offered at discount prices that are less than standard prices.
- 14. The licensee will develop a designated driver program where licensee will offer free non-alcoholic beverages to designated drivers.
- 15. That local government, including the County Sheriff, the District County Supervisor and the Mayor of the City of Solvang, be notified by the Department in writing if this permit is being considered for an amendment or any additional permits are applied for by the Tribe or its agents.
