
## We live in one of the world's top "hot spots" for biodiversity.

Gaviota contains 34 watersheds.

The Gaviota Coast is considered <u>one of</u> the top 15 hot spots for **threatened** biodiversity in the world. More than 1,400 plant and animal species depend on the Gaviota, including 60 species of fish and 195 species of birds.


The area contains 24 federally- or state-listed threatened or endangered plant and animal species and another 60 species of rare and special concern.
