

Project Location Map: Santa Barbara, California. UC Santa Barbara Campus and County Beach Park adjacent to airport and highways 217 and 101.



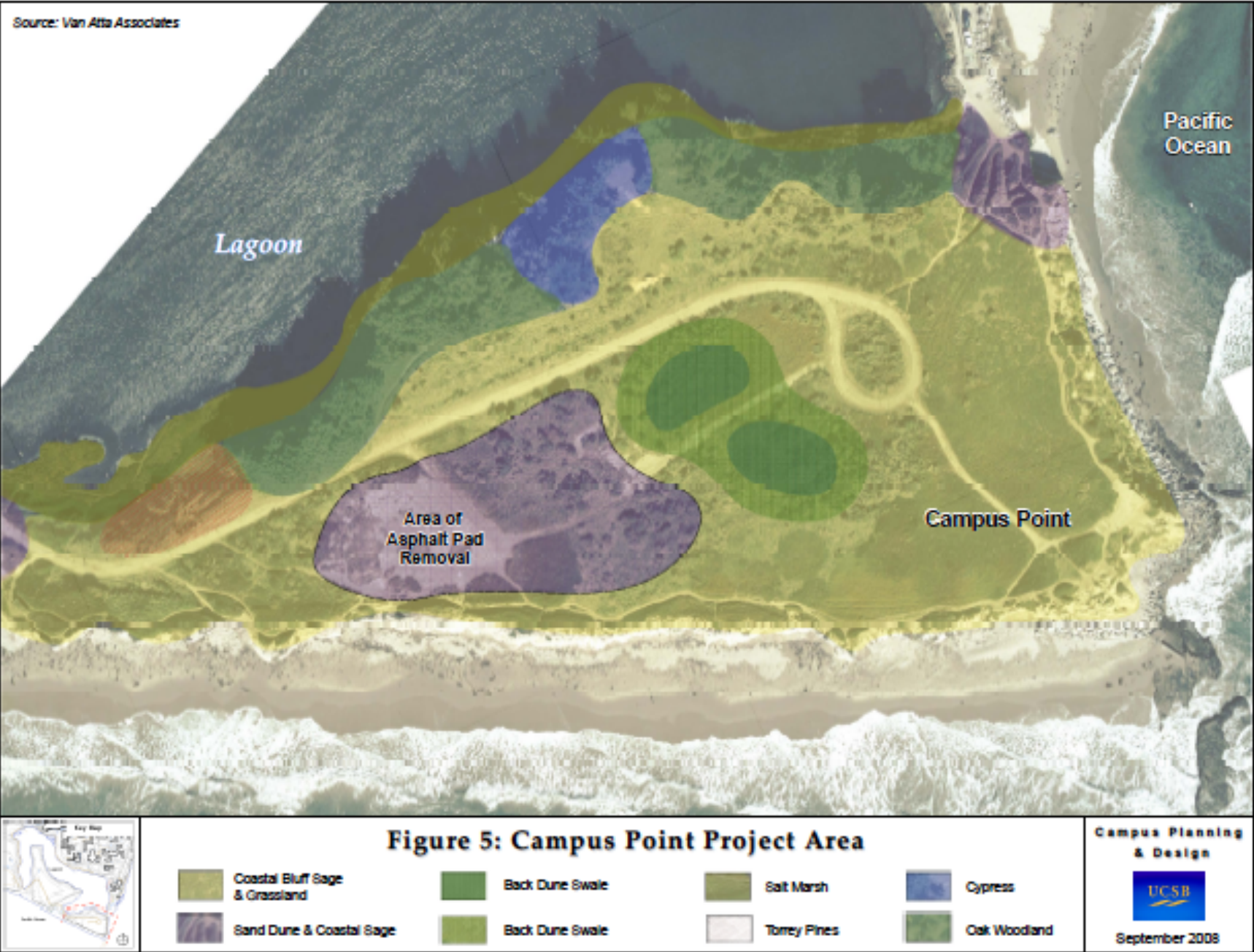

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Approved Restoration Plan for Campus Point





Area in green has been restored over the past 10 years as funding has allowed. Remaining area is being solarized in preparation for this restoration project.

Desired outcomes:

- Complete Restoration of 5 acres of Coastal Mesa along the California Coastal Trail and on UCSB Campus with diverse coastal bluff scrub, dune and back-dune swale plantings.
- Remove nearly an acre of asphalt from military era impacts and reduce run-off issues
- Work with coastal Chumash representatives to protect previously disturbed midden
- Interpret land-use history, petrified whale fossils, and/or historic Chumash use of coastal resources in two signs
- Support and enhance Coastal Access for over 30 users/hr from diverse communities.
