Hello, this is Maria Ygnacio Farm Collective Incs comments regarding tomorrows hearing for cannabis business license ordinances.

Besides the fact that our zone has become a non commercial zone for cannabis operations which could stop us from doing business after being established since 2009, there seems to be no direct direction for existing cultivators who are not zoned correctly and who are going through the amortization process that have temporary licenses.

As you know, to stay in compliance we must be state approved. During the amortization process, we must stay in compliance at a county and state level.

Supervisors, please direct staff to give an annual license to non conforming operations so we can stay in compliance with county as same existing operation, and go through state licensing regulations so our amortization process can continue as we navigate all these regulations.

Our temporary license will not cover the whole year and into next, therefore county must allow existing operations to operate as they are and receive an annual license authorization, until amortization process is terminated. Not doing so would mean our business cannot continue operating until we find a suitable zoned area, and the amortization process isn't actually in action.
