**Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture for support of services related to the Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP) Bulk Citrus Inspection Program in the County of Santa Barbara for the period of May 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 in the amount of \$22,681.12; and
- B. Determine that the proposed action involves government funding mechanisms and/or fiscal activities and is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(4) and direct staff to file a notice of exemption.

**Summary Text:**

This item is on the agenda for the Board of Supervisors to approve, ratify, and authorize an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) to receive reimbursement for the County's Asian Citrus Psyllid (ACP) Program. Through this agreement, the CDFA reimburses the Santa Barbara County Agricultural Commissioner's Office for the cost associated with the regulatory enforcement activities related to the movement of bulk citrus within and out of the state of California.

**Background:**

Asian Citrus Psyllid, *Diaphorina citri*, is a small aphid like insect that spreads a destructive and often fatal disease of citrus and closely related plants called Huanglongbing (HLB) or Citrus Greening Disease. This is the first year the CDFA has made funds available for distribution to County Agricultural Commissioner’s Offices. The funding for this program is anticipated to continue to provide reimbursement for our ACP Bulk Citrus Program activities.
