Dear Santa Barbara County Supervisors and CEO Miyasato:

As you know, EconAlliance is a cross-industry nonprofit working to build support and appreciation for Northern Santa Barbara County industries and communities.

There is an initiative before you requesting an increase in the minimum wage to \$26/hour for county agriculture workers, which is a 62% increase over the state minimum wage of \$16/hour. EconAlliance is very concerned about the potential impacts of this increase should it be adopted:

- ---- California's strawberry sector and many other crop sectors are already having serious sustainability challenges (county strawberry growers are projecting major losses this year), this increase would immediately eliminate many ag/wine grape businesses/jobs in our county who are already facing heavy domestic and international competitive pressure.
- ---- We are concerned about pressure to duplicate this rate in other sectors (manufacturing, retail, hospitality) should this initiative be adopted, severely impacting current efforts to rebound from the pandemic and build our community
- ---- Adoption of this initiative would put major upward pressure on all non-minimumwage ag jobs, creating a new minimum salary of over \$100,000 and eliminating the competitiveness of not just ag producers but also ag service companies.

We believe your thorough research will reveal many probable negative economic impacts of the adoption of a \$26/hr ag minimum wage, including both major losses of jobs and county income which would negatively impact the very community this proposal seeks to benefit. Thank you for your careful consideration of this matter.
