



County Supervisorial Redistricting Update

January 11, 2022



District Boundary Changes Adopted by CIRC

- Citizens' Independent Redistricting Commission (CIRC) adopted final plan on December 13
- In accordance with County Code Section 2-10.9A
 - CIRC submitted adopted plan to County Elections December 14
 - New boundaries effective 30 days later (January 13, 2022)
- CIRC plans to schedule a final debriefing meeting late January to discuss process improvements for next redistricting

The Process

- 11 Commission Members (2 from each district and 1 at large)
- 39 Public Meetings Held
 - **First meeting December 8, 2020**
 - **Last meeting December 13, 2021**
 - **Hundreds of County participants**
 - **More than 1700 public comments**
 - **114 draft maps received**

CIRC Information and Historical Retention

- Detailed Information Retained for 10 years
 - Agendas, minutes, public comments and videos
 - Draft maps submitted
 - Commissioner Bios and Resources
 - Adopted Map with look up by address search capability

District Boundary Changes

- All 5 district boundaries incurred changes
- All current Board of Supervisors remain qualified representatives of districts
- Some Board appointed boards, commissions and committees may be impacted – Administrators notified

Most Significant District Boundary Changes

- D1 – West Cuyama Valley moved from D5
- D2 – Isla Vista and UCSB moved from D3
- D3 – Lompoc area moved from D4
- D4 – Los Alamos, Vandenberg Village and VSFB moved from D3
- D5 – Guadalupe area moved from D3
