LOCATION: On the south side of Oak Hill Drive from the centerline of Stanford Circle to a point 34 feet west of the center line of Stanford Circle.

PROJECT TITLE: Oak Hill Drive No Parking Zone.

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Public Works Department proposes to install a no zone parking zone immediately adjacent to a Vandenberg Village Community Service District (VVSCD) equipment vault. VVCSD has a water pressure booster station in this area and a no parking zone warranted to provide a safe manner in which to use park service vehicles to conduct maintenance within the adjacent equipment vault. The "No Parking" zone of approximately 20 feet would not be a major inconvenience to the neighborhood.

Reasons to support exemption findings: The project is a safety improvement for maintenance activities and therefore is contemplated by the CEQA exemption under section 15301. Further, there are no unusual circumstances which would create a possibility that there would be a significant effect. The project is minor alteration of an existing public facility designed to maintain a safe traveling condition of the highway facility as it was constructed.
