Dear Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors,

I am a California politician, President Cristina Grappo, and I care about the environmental state of affairs to ban fracking and I want my voice to count, especially representing Oakland as MAYOR ASAP.

I urge you to deny this dangerous project as recommended by the Santa Barbara Planning Commission.

In addition to the significant and unavoidable risks of spills from trucking the oil, the purported benefit of producing oil from the offshore platforms and processing it on the Gaviota coast would bring with it unacceptable risks of offshore oil spills, air pollution and toxic fire and smoke risks that were not analyzed in the EIR, which focused narrowly on trucking impacts.

The recent oil spill off of Orange County underlines the severity of these risks. In addition, ExxonMobil's facilities were the largest sources of air pollution in the county and contained dangerous and toxic materials in an area that has burned by wildfire twice in the 6 years since the facilities have been shut down. We were fortunate that oil and dangerous gases were not present at the site during the recent Alisal fire, which burned onto ExxonMobil's property.

It is not just that the trucking routes are along sections of road with above average accident rates, there have been specific and recent instances of oil tankers on this route spilling oil into rivers and starting fires. In fact, on October 11 -- the same day as the Alisal fire -- an oil tanker crash near Orcutt caused a fire in Eucalyptus trees.

Thank you for denying this dangerous and unacceptable oil trucking project.

Dear Mr. Savrnoch:

I am a long-time resident of Isla Vista, CA. Parking is a perennial problem throughout Isla Vista. There is no enforcement whatsoever unless, as residents, we sent photos of license plates to the California Highway Patrol. In those instances, it can take over ten days before an officer yellow tags and then tows the vehicle.

Our taxes pay for an "Isla Vista Foot Patrol" that deals with parties, fights, drug overdoses, etc. They do not have the personnel to enforce any parking violations. Their response to reporting a vehicle parked for a week on a corner in front of a fire hydrant is "Call the CHP."

California's "Daylighting" law (AB 413) is supposed to protect pedestrians. That is not happening in Isla Vista. There are cars parked on every single corner with or without red paint. In addition, our 3-4 contiguous sidewalks are continuously obstructed by vehicles.

Walking in Isla Vista is hazardous. This is particularly unacceptable when one considers the hundreds of thousands of CARB grant dollars obtained by local government to create "mobility plans" for Isla Vista. Enforcing black letter law is not part of the mobility plan.

If someone is hurt walking in Isla Vista Santa Barbara County can and should be held accountable. Why is Santa Barbara County not enforcing parking laws in Isla Vista?
