WHEREAS, the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to establish the Arts Commission in March 1977 with a goal to foster and promote the arts throughout the County for the benefit of the public and increase accessibility of the arts for all citizens, recognizing the value of arts and culture in

WHEREAS, for 30 years, the Arts Commission and its County Art in Public Places (CAPP) Committee have supervised the selection and display of public art acquisitions made possible through the One Percent for Art Ordinance and private gifts; and

WHEREAS, the Arts Commission established a public art gallery in 1989 to provide a free public space to display art of interest to the residents of the county and showcase the work of regional artists. The gallery was named the Channing Peake Gallery in recognition of the significant contributions of the renowned California artist, muralist and long time Santa Barbara County arts advocate; and

WHEREAS, the Channing Peake Gallery has served for the last 20 years as a valuable cultural venue presenting more than 60 public exhibitions and hosting free artist receptions, lectures, gallery talks, and performances, all in the heart of the Historic Cultural Arts District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED AND RESLOVED that this Board of Supervisors celebrates the 20th Anniversary of the Channing Peake Gallery, commends and thanks the Arts Commission for their dedication to making the arts accessible to the community, and encourages all residents to participate in current and future exhibitions and cultural activities.
