offenders and increase of victim restitution collection fee

Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Designate the Probation Department as the agency responsible for collecting fines, fees, and restitution from persons sentenced under California Penal Code (PC) Section 1170 (h).
- 2. Adopt the attached resolution setting the fee pursuant to PC Section 1203.1 (l) for the administrative cost of collecting restitution on adult offenders at 15% of the amount of restitution ordered.

Summary Text:

The Public Safety Realignment Act transferred responsibility for supervising and incarcerating certain lower level felony offenders from the state to counties. The new legislation however failed to identify which local agency is to collect fines, fees, and restitution from the offenders who, under realignment, are now ordered to serve their sentences locally. Senate Bill (SB) 1020 provides clean up language and allows the Board of Supervisors of each county to designate the local agency responsible for collections. The Probation Department is requesting that the Board of Supervisors designate it as the authorized agency.

The designation of Probation as the responsible agency will allow for the collection of fines, fees, and restitution from these offenders. Agencies responsible for the collection of restitution are allowed to collect an administrative fee which was previously capped at 10% of the restitution ordered. The capped maximum was recently increased to 15% of the restitution ordered. The actual average cost of collecting restitution exceeds 15% of the amount collected and therefore the Probation Department is requesting that your Board adopt the attached resolution increasing the administrative fee to 15% of the amount ordered.

Background:

The 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act transferred responsibility for specified lower level felony offenders from the state's jurisdiction to counties. The two populations are the Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) or parolees released from state prison and supervised locally by the Probation Department and offenders who are sentenced under PC Section 1170 (h) and are ordered to serve their custody time in county jail rather than in state prison. While the responsibility for the collection of fines and restitution for the PRCS population remains with the state, realignment failed to specify which local agency was granted authority for collecting fines, fees, and restitution for the offenders serving their time in county jail. In September 2012, clean up language included in SB1020 provides authority to the Board of Supervisors of each county to designate the local agency that will have authority to collect fines, fees and restitution from these offenders. The Probation Department is requesting that your Board designate it as the authorized agency.

In addition, California Penal Code (PC) Section 1203.1 (l) authorizes agencies responsible for collecting victim restitution to charge a fee to recover the actual administrative cost of collecting restitution. On April 11, 1989, the Board of Supervisors adopted a fee of 10% of the amount of restitution ordered by the Court which was the statutorily allowed maximum at the time. PC 1203.1 was recently amended to increase the maximum to 15% of the restitution amount ordered by the Court. The Probation Department's actual costs of collecting restitution exceeds the 15% and is requesting that your Board adopt the attached resolution increasing the fee to 15% of the amount of victim restitution ordered by the Court.

Fiscal Analysis:

Designation of the Probation Department as the agency in the county responsible for the collection of restitution, fines, and fees from offenders sentenced pursuant to PC 1170 (h) will not result in a fiscal impact to the Department. The Department anticipates collecting \$16,000 in FY 2012-13 based on the 10% fee for collecting restitution in FY 2012-13. Increasing the administrative charge for collecting restitution could result in an increase to revenue over time. However the increase will be gradual as the new fee will only apply to offenders sentenced after the effective date of the increase and State law requires that restitution be fully satisfied before collections are applied to any fines or fees.
