SUBJECT: 76-AP-064, Fazio Agricultural Preserve Non-Renewal

Recommendation:

Set date to hear the request of County of Santa Barbara, Agricultural Preserve Advisory Committee to consider Case No. 76-AP-064 for non-renewal of an existing agricultural preserve contract. The subject non-renewal involves Assessor's Parcel Nos. 005-670-001, -002, -003, located north of Highway 101, approximately ½ mile north of the intersection of Via Real and Toro Canyon Road, known as 338 Toro Canyon Road, in the Carpinteria area, First Supervisorial District (SET DATE FOR ADMINISTRATIVE AGENDA ON NOVEMBER 22, 2005).

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation is primarily aligned with actions required by law or by routine business necessity.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The subject properties have been in an agricultural preserve (76-AP-64) since January 1, 1977. The non-renewal was heard by the Agricultural Preserve Advisory Committee on June 10, 2005. The site is approximately 10 acres and is used for crops. The effective date for nonrenewal of the contract will be December 31, 2005.

Section 51245 of the Government Code provides that if either the landowner or the County desires in any year not to renew an agricultural preserve contract, that party shall serve written notice of nonrenewal of the contract upon the other party in advance of the annual renewal date of the contract. The Agricultural Preserve Advisory Committee's position is that while it does not encourage removal of property from preserve status, it recognizes that pursuant to the Uniform Rules of the County's Agricultural Preserve Program, nonrenewal is an accepted method for terminating a contract when the landowner does not comply with the Uniform Rules.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Government Code §51200 (known as the California Land Conservation Act of 1965 or the Williamson Act) provides that local jurisdictions may establish an agricultural preserve program having the goal of retaining land in an agricultural use. The County of Santa Barbara has adopted such a program which is codified under the Agricultural Preserve Program Uniform Rules. Both the County's Uniform Rules and the Government Code provide that agricultural preserve contracts between the County and landowners are voluntary. Therefore, there are no state mandates associated with this program.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The costs associated with processing this contract non-renewal are offset by fees required to be paid by the applicant per the Planning & Development adopted fee schedule.

Permit revenues are budgeted in the Permitting & Compliance Program of the Development Review, North Division on Page D-296 of the adopted 2005 – 2006 fiscal year budget.

After recordation of non-renewal, property taxes on this site will be incrementally increased for the next ten years until full property taxes are assessed.
